IN RE: HB2787 by Springer (Relating to authorization for certain health care facilities to secure residents with wheelchair safety belts.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Chapter 322 of the Health and Safety Code to authorize certain health care facilities to secure a resident with a wheelchair safety belt if the resident or the resident's legal guardian provides written consent. It is anticipated that the duties and responsibilities of implementing agencies would be accomplished through existing resources.
