IN RE: HB3312 by Geren (Relating to the taking of an additional specimen of a person's blood on arrest for certain intoxication offenses.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Transportation Code to specify the individual who requests an additional specimen of blood is responsible for the costs associated with the sample and the specimen is not required to be analyzed by a lab accredited by the Department of Public Safety. Under the provisions of the bill, if peace officer or other individual interferes with an independent analysis of a blood specimen, the analysis taken by order of the peace officer is inadmissible as evidence in court.

The Office of Court Administration reported no significant fiscal impact to the state court is anticipated.
