IN RE: HB3783 by Kacal (Relating to the prosecution of the criminal offense of obstructing a street, railroad crossing, or public highway.), **As Introduced**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Transportation Code to modify an offense, punishable by a fine of \$100 to \$300, of a railway company obstructing a street or crossing for more than 10 minutes and as a result an authorized emergency vehicle is prevented from taking the most direct route to an emergency.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
