**IN RE: HB3790** by Fletcher (Relating to the electronic customer data that certain peace officers may obtain by warrant, order, or other legal process from a provider of a wire or electronic communications service or remote computing service or from a communication common carrier.), **As Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure to specify what electronic customer data may be collected by an authorized peace officer possessing a warrant, order, or other legal process from a provider of a wire or electronic communications service, a remote computing service, or a communication common carrier. It is assumed any costs associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
