IN RE: **HB4077** by Guillen (relating to adding carbon dioxide in compressed canisters to the definition of abusable volatile chemicals; requiring a volatile chemical sales permit to sell carbon dioxide canisters; amending provisions subject to criminal and administrative penalties.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Chapter 485 of the Health and Safety Code to include carbon dioxide in the form of a compressed gas propellant and meeting certain criteria in the definition of an abusable volatile chemical. The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) indicates that inspection, enforcement, and rulemaking activities required to implement the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
