IN RE: HB4101 by Bernal (Relating to the allocation of low income housing tax credits set aside for at-risk developments.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Government Code relating to the allocation of low income housing tax credits set aside for at-risk developments. Based on the analysis of the Department of Housing and Community Affairs, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
