**IN RE:** SB336 by Taylor, Van (Relating to the right of municipal officers to obtain information, documents, and records.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Local Government Code to permit a municipal officer the right to access certain information from a municipal governmental body. The bill would establish a procedure of maintaining confidentiality of the information. Under the provisions of the bill, a municipal officer may seek a decision from the Attorney General whether information is confidential or excepted from disclosure. The Attorney General would be required to respond to the county by issuing a written decision within 45 days or within an extension of the 45 day period by 10 business days. The municipal officer or municipal governing body may appeal the decision to a district court under certain conditions.

The Office of Court Administration reported no significant fiscal impact to the state court system is anticipated.

**Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
