IN RE: SB414 by Campbell (Relating to a suit for possession of or access to a child by a grandparent.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would make provisions relating to frivolous suits, attorney fees, consolidated suits and evidentiary burdens, among others. The Office of Court Administration indicates bill provisions are not anticipated to have a significant fiscal implication to the state court system. The Department of Family and Protective Services indicates the agency can implement bill provisions within its existing resources.
