Relating to the transportation and storage of firearms and ammunition in private vehicles on the campuses of institutions of higher education.

HB 1887 Muñoz, Jr. | et al.
Relating to the establishment of a regional center for public safety excellence in the Rio Grande Valley.

HB 1997 Paddie
Relating to requiring direct access to 9-1-1 service from certain telephone systems and Internet Protocol services.

HB 2018 Schaefer
Relating to abolishing the regulation of guard dog trainers.

HB 2161 Simmons
Relating to the regulation of certain private security companies and occupations.

HB 2197 Springer
Relating to fingerprinting requirements for occupational licenses.

HB 2246 Villalba
Relating to the suspension and issuance of certain driver's licenses; affecting the prosecution of an offense; increasing fees.

HB 2358 Lucio III
Relating to the exemption from certain registration and licensing requirements and taxes for certain businesses and employees who enter this state in response to a disaster or emergency.

HB 2359 Bohac
Relating to prohibiting the Department of Public Safety from responding to bulk requests from the federal government for lists of individuals licensed to carry a concealed handgun; creating a criminal offense.

Relating to the notice given by a property owner prohibiting a concealed handgun license holder from carrying a handgun on certain property.

HB 2513 Kacal
Relating to the provision of automatic location identification and automatic tier two facility identification as part of the 9-1-1 system.

HB 2583 Bell
Relating to access to criminal history record information by a county sheriff in certain counties.

HB 2671 Thompson, Senfronia
Relating to the suspension of a driver's license or denial of a driver's license renewal for failure to pay a debt owed to a governmental entity or failure to appear in court.

HB 2680 Bonnen, Greg | et al.
Relating to allocation of money from the law enforcement officer standards and education fund.

HB 2744 Capriglione
Relating to the use of automatic license plate readers by a law enforcement agency.

HB 2806 Lozano
Relating to the prosecution of and increasing the punishment for the offense of unlawful smuggling or concealment of persons; creating an offense.

HB 2999 Landgraf
Relating to restrictive covenants regarding the possession, transportation, or storage of firearms or firearms ammunition and the otherwise lawful discharge of a firearm.

HB 3016 Fletcher
Relating to fingerprints collected by the Texas Department of Public Safety from an applicant for a driver's license or personal identification certificate and used for the department's image verification system.

Relating to training requirements for peace officers appointed to supervisory positions.
