AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, 7 is amended by adding Section 42.025 to read as follows:

Sec. <u>42.025</u>. <u>SEARCHABLE</u> <u>DATABASE</u>. (a) <u>The department</u> 8 shall maintain on the department's Internet website a searchable 9 database that includes the name, the address, and any 10 identification number, as applicable, of each family home 11 registered or listed under this chapter that previously had a 12 13 registration or listing involuntarily suspended or revoked under this chapter with a permanent notation indicating the involuntary 14 15 suspension or revocation and the year in which the suspension or 16 revocation took effect or was final under this chapter.

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(b) The executive commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to implement this section.

19 SECTION 2. Not later than December 31, 2015, the Department 20 of Family and Protective Services shall include in a searchable 21 database the information required by Section 42.025, Human 22 Resources Code, as added by this Act, and the involuntary 23 suspension and revocation information on a registered or listed 24 family home for at least the five years preceding the date the

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1 information is added to the database.

2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

Fiscal Analysis

The bill would amend Chapter 42 of the Human Resources Code and require the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) to establish on the department's website a searchable database containing information on certain child-care facilities and residential child-facilities.

Methodology

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The agency has indicated they would need \$705,304 in FY2016 to pay for modifications to the Public Provider system, the CLASS system, and to the website. It is assumed any costs at the Health and Human Services Commission associated with adopting rules to implement the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

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Technology

The implementation of the bill would require \$705,304 in FY2016 for technology costs.
