4	SECTION 1. Section 43.106, Local Government Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 43.106. ANNEXATION OF COUNTY ROADS REQUIRED IN CERTAIN
7	CIRCUMSTANCES. (a) A municipality that proposes to annex any
8	portion of a [paved] county road or territory that abuts a county
9	road must also annex the entire width of the county road and the
10	adjacent right-of-way on both sides of the county road.
11	(b) If a road annexed under Subsection (a) is a gravel road,
12	the county retains control of granting access to the road and its
13	<pre>right-of-way from property that:</pre>
14	(1) is not located in the boundaries of the annexing
15	municipality; and
16	(2) is adjacent to the road and right-of-way.
17	SECTION 2. Section 43.106, Local Government Code, as
18	amended by this Act, applies to an area proposed for annexation on
19	or after the effective date of this Act or before the effective date
20	of this Act if the statutory requirements for annexation under
21	Subchapter C or C-1, Chapter 43, Local Government Code, have not
22	been completed before the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

Amend H.B. 1949 (senate committee printing) by adding the 1 following appropriately numbered SECTION 2 to the bill and 3 renumbering subsequent SECTIONS accordingly: SECTION . Section 43.028, Local Government Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Subsections (g) and (h) to read as follows: 6 (g) An area of land that would be eligible for annexation 7 under this section except that the area does not meet the 8 contiguity requirement of Subsection (a)(2) may be annexed under this section if a public right-of-way of a road or highway 9 10 designated by the municipality exists that: (1) is located entirely in the extraterritorial 11 12 jurisdiction of the municipality; and 13 (2) when added to the area would cause the area to be 14 contiguous to the municipality. (h) Notwithstanding Section 43.054, on annexation of an 15 area described by Subsection (g), the public right-of-way that 16 17 makes the area eligible for annexation under Subsection (g) is 18 included in the annexation to the municipality without regard to 19 whether the owners of the public right-of-way sought annexation 20 under this section. The ordinance providing for annexation must 21 provide a metes and bounds description of the public right-of-
