10	SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 614, Government Code, as
11	added by Chapter 938 (H.B. 3613), Acts of the 80th Legislature,
12	Regular Session, 2007, is amended by adding Section 614.1241 to
13	read as follows:
14	Sec. 614.1241. QUALIFIED RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.
15	(a) On request of a qualified retired law enforcement officer who
16	holds a certificate of proficiency under Section 1701.357,
17	Occupations Code, the law enforcement agency or other governmental
18	entity in this state that was the last entity to appoint or employ
19	the qualified retired law enforcement officer as a peace officer
20	shall issue an identification card to the qualified retired law
21	enforcement officer.
22	(b) The identification card must include:
23	(1) the full name of the qualified retired law
24	enforcement officer;

- 2 enforcement officer consistent with the qualified retired law
- 3 enforcement officer's appearance;
