A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 33.908 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 33.908. GRACE PERIOD POLICY FOR EXHAUSTED OF
9	INSUFFICIENT MEAL CARD OR ACCOUNT BALANCE. A school district that
10	allows students to use a prepaid meal card or account to purchase
11	meals served at the school shall adopt a grace period policy
12	regarding the use of the cards or accounts. The policy:
13	(1) must allow a student whose meal card or account
14	balance is exhausted or insufficient to continue, for a period
15	determined by the district, to purchase meals by:
16	(A) accumulating a negative balance on the
17	student's card or account; or
18	(B) otherwise receiving an extension of credit
19	<pre>from the district;</pre>
20	(2) must require the district to notify the parent of
21	or person standing in parental relation to the student that the
22	student's meal card or account balance is exhausted; and
23	(3) may not permit the district to charge a fee or
24	interest in connection with meals purchased under Subdivision (1).

- 1 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 2 school year.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require school districts to adopt a policy to allow for the accumulation of a negative balance or receiving an extension of credit or account balance if a meal card used by students to purchase meals in public schools was exhausted or insufficient. The policy would require notification of the parent or person standing in parental relation to the student that the meal card or account was exhausted and would not permit a fee or interest to be charged.

Local Government Impact

There would be some administrative costs to school districts to track negative balances or extension of credit and potential lost revenue. These amounts would vary from district to district depending on whether the district offered prepaid meal cards or accounts and how many students maintained negative balances or received credit.
