- (b) The governing body of the emergency services district 1 2 shall call an election under this section if a petition requesting that an election to withdraw from the authority be held is submitted 3 to the governing body and is signed by at least 10 percent of the 4 registered voters of the district on the date the petition is 5 6 submitted. To be counted for purposes of validating the petition, a 7 signature on the petition must have been inscribed not earlier than the 120th day before the date the petition is submitted to the 8 9 governing body.
- 10 (c) The governing body, before the 31st day after the date
 11 the petition is submitted to the governing body, shall determine
 12 whether a petition under this section is valid, and if the governing
 13 body fails to act on the petition before the expiration of that
 14 period, the petition is valid.
- (d) Sections 451.601, 451.607, 451.608, 451.609, 451.611,
 451.612(a), and 451.613 apply to the withdrawal of an emergency
 services district under this section.
- 18 <u>(e) An election may not be called under this section to be</u>
 19 <u>held on a date earlier than the first anniversary of the date of the</u>
 20 most recent election held under this section.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Transportation Code to permit an emergency services district to withdraw from the territory of a metro rapid transit authority if a majority of the registered voters of a district vote and approve at an election the withdraw from the authority. The bill would require a governing body of an emergency services district to call an election if a petition is received and validated as having 10% of the registered voters of the district signatures, requesting an election on the withdrawing of the authority. The bill would prohibit an election from being called earlier than the first anniversary of the date of the most recent election held under the provisions of the bill.

Local Government Impact

The costs of elections would vary depending on the number of elections required by valid petitions and the number of registered voters of an emergency services district. However, there is no way to estimate which districts will receive the necessary petitions to require an election. The fiscal impact of the bill on local governments cannot be determined.

The bill would require a governing body of an emergency services district to call an election if a petition is received and validated as having 10% of the registered voters of the district signatures, requesting an election on the withdrawing of the authority. The bill would prohibit an election from being called earlier than the first anniversary of the date of the most recent election held under the provisions of the bill.

Local Government Impact

The costs of elections would vary depending on the number of elections required by valid petitions and the number of registered voters of an emergency services district. However, there is no way to estimate which districts will receive the necessary petitions to require an election. The fiscal impact of the bill on local governments cannot be determined.
