- 1 Amend C.S.H.B. No. 21 (house committee printing) by adding 2 the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and 3 renumbering SECTIONS accordingly: 4 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 33.0832 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 33.0832. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY FOR HOME-SCHOOLED STUDENTS 7 TO PARTICIPATE IN UNIVERSITY INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE ACTIVITIES. 8 (a) In this section, "home-schooled student" has the meaning assigned by Section 29.916. 9 10 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (h), a public school 11 that participates in an activity sponsored by the University 12 Interscholastic League shall provide a home-schooled student, who otherwise meets <u>league</u> eligibility standards to represent that 13 school in a league activity, with the opportunity to participate in 14 15 the activity on behalf of the school in the same manner that the 16 school provides the opportunity to participate to students enrolled 17 in the school. (c) The board of trustees of each school district shall 18 require each school in the district that participates in an 19 activity sponsored by the University Interscholastic League to 20 21 provide a home-schooled student with the opportunity to participate in the activity in accordance with Subsection (b) without imposing 22 23 a fee or other requirement in addition to a fee or other requirement provided by this section. If a school district board of trustees 24 25 fails to comply with this subsection, the district is not entitled to receive state funds under this title, including funds to which a 26

(d) A home-schooled student who seeks to participate or who

- 1 to the following relevant policies that apply to students enrolled
- 2 in the school: policies regarding registration, age eligibility,
- 3 fees, insurance, transportation, physical condition,
- 4 qualifications, responsibilities, event schedules, standards of
- 5 behavior, and performance.
- 6 (e) The parent or person standing in parental relation to a
- 7 home-schooled student is responsible for oversight of academic
- 8 standards relating to the student's participation in a league
- 9 activity. As a condition of eligibility to participate in a league
- 10 activity during the first six weeks of a school year, a
- 11 home-schooled student must demonstrate grade-level academic
- 12 proficiency on any nationally recognized, norm-referenced
- 13 assessment instrument, such as the Iowa Test of Basic Skills,
- 14 Stanford Achievement Test, California Achievement Test, or
- 15 Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills. A home-schooled student
- 16 demonstrates the required academic proficiency by achieving a
- 17 composite, core, or survey score that is within the average or
- 18 <u>higher than average range of scores</u>, as established by the
- 19 applicable testing service. For purposes of this subsection, a
- 20 school district shall accept assessment results administered or
- 21 reported by a third party.
- 22 (f) A home-schooled student's demonstration of academic
- 23 proficiency under Subsection (e) is sufficient for purposes of that
- 24 subsection for the school year in which the student achieves the
- 25 required score and the subsequent school year.
- 26 (g) After the first six weeks of a school year, the parent or
- 27 person standing in parental relation to a home-schooled student
- 28 participating in a league activity on behalf of a public school must
- 29 periodically, in accordance with the school's grading calendar,
- 30 provide written verification to the school indicating that the
- 31 student is receiving a passing grade in each course or subject being

- 1 taught.
- 2 (h) A home-schooled student is not authorized by this
- 3 section to participate in a league activity during the remainder of
- 4 any school year during which the student was previously enrolled in
- 5 a public school.
- 6 (i) The University Interscholastic League may not prohibit
- 7 a home-schooled student from participating in league activities in
- 8 the manner authorized by this section.
- 9 (j) With respect to a home-schooled student's education
- 10 program, nothing in this section shall be construed to permit an
- 11 agency of this state, a school district, or any other governmental
- 12 body to exercise control, regulatory authority, or supervision over
- 13 a home-schooled student or a parent or person standing in parental
- 14 relation to a home-schooled student beyond the control, regulatory
- 15 authority, or supervision required to participate in a league
- 16 <u>activity</u>.
- 17 (k) Subject only to eligibility requirements under this
- 18 section for a home-schooled student to participate in a league
- 19 <u>activity:</u>
- 20 (1) the curriculum or assessment requirements,
- 21 performance standards, practices, or creed of the education program
- 22 provided to a home-schooled student may not be required to be
- 23 changed in order for the home-schooled student to participate in a
- 24 league activity; and
- 25 (2) for a home-schooled student participating in an
- 26 education program on January 1, 2017, the education program
- 27 provided to that student may not be required to comply with any
- 28 state law or agency rule relating to that education program unless
- 29 the law or rule was in effect on January 1, 2017.
