1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the transfer of certain appropriations to the Texas
- 3 Education Agency and the Teacher Retirement System of Texas and the
- 4 adjustment of appropriations for public school finance.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) The amount of \$351,000,000 of the
- 7 unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund for the
- 8 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, made by S.B. 1, Acts
- 9 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
- 10 Appropriations Act), to the Health and Human Services Commission is
- 11 transferred to the Texas Education Agency to be used by the agency
- 12 during that state fiscal biennium as follows:
- 13 (1) \$150,000,000 is allocated to fund financial
- 14 hardship grants under Subchapter H, Chapter 42, Education Code, as
- 15 added by H.B. 21, Acts of the 85th Legislature, 1st Called Session,
- 16 2017, or similar legislation that enacts a new hardship grant
- 17 program for the benefit of school districts that would otherwise
- 18 experience a significant loss of revenue during the 2017-2018 or
- 19 2018-2019 school year;
- 20 (2) \$60,000,000 is allocated to fund payments to
- 21 open-enrollment charter schools under Section 12.106(d), Education
- 22 Code, as added by H.B. 21, Acts of the 85th Legislature, 1st Called
- 23 Session, 2017, or similar legislation that provides for funding to
- 24 open-enrollment charter schools for instructional facilities;

- 1 (3) \$60,000,000 is allocated for the existing debt
- 2 allotment under Section 46.032, Education Code, as amended by H.B.
- 3 21, Acts of the 85th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 2017, or
- 4 similar legislation that increases the level of funding under that
- 5 allotment;
- 6 (4) \$41,000,000 is allocated for the small-sized
- 7 district adjustment under Section 42.103, Education Code, as
- 8 amended by H.B. 21, Acts of the 85th Legislature, 1st Called
- 9 Session, 2017, or similar legislation that addresses the
- 10 entitlement under that adjustment for certain school districts that
- 11 contain less than 300 square miles;
- 12 (5) \$20,000,000 is allocated to be used to award
- 13 grants authorized under Section 29.026, Education Code, as added by
- 14 H.B. 21, Acts of the 85th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 2017, or
- 15 similar legislation that enacts a program to award grants to school
- 16 districts and open-enrollment charter schools that provide
- 17 innovative services to students with autism; and
- 18 (6) \$20,000,000 is allocated to be used to award
- 19 grants authorized under Section 29.027, Education Code, as added by
- 20 H.B. 21, Acts of the 85th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 2017, or
- 21 similar legislation that enacts a program to award grants to school
- 22 districts and open-enrollment charter schools that provide
- 23 innovative services to students with dyslexia.
- 24 (b) The Health and Human Services Commission shall identify
- 25 the strategies and objectives out of which the transfer under
- 26 Subsection (a) of this section is to be made. If the commission
- 27 makes the amount of appropriations transferred under Subsection (a)

- 1 of this section available by delaying until the state fiscal
- 2 biennium beginning September 1, 2019, the monthly capitation
- 3 payments otherwise due in August 2019 to managed care organizations
- 4 that contract with the commission to provide health care services
- 5 to Medicaid recipients, the commission shall make the delayed
- 6 payments as soon as possible out of available money appropriated to
- 7 the commission for that state fiscal biennium.
- 8 (c) Notwithstanding the sum-certain appropriations
- 9 specified in Rider 3, Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th
- 10 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations
- 11 Act), to the bill pattern of the appropriations to the Texas
- 12 Education Agency, the Legislative Budget Board shall determine the
- 13 sum-certain appropriation to the Foundation School Program for each
- 14 year of the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2017,
- 15 based on the amount specified in that rider, the other provisions of
- 16 the General Appropriations Act, and other law, including the
- 17 provisions of this Act.
- 18 (d) If H.B. 21, Acts of the 85th Legislature, 1st Called
- 19 Session, 2017, or another similar Act that addresses additional
- 20 funding under the public school finance system for the components
- 21 described in Subsection (a) of this section also transfers and
- 22 allocates to those components the amount of unencumbered
- 23 appropriations in the manner provided by that subsection, the
- 24 transfer and allocation under Subsection (a) of this section does
- 25 not occur.
- 26 SECTION 2. (a) The amount of \$212,000,000 of the
- 27 unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund for the

- 1 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, made by S.B. 1, Acts
- 2 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
- 3 Appropriations Act), to the Health and Human Services Commission is
- 4 transferred to the Teacher Retirement System of Texas and may be
- 5 used by the retirement system during that state fiscal biennium to
- 6 increase school districts' recruitment and retention of school
- 7 teachers and provide support to participants in the Texas Public
- 8 School Employees Group Insurance Program authorized by Chapter
- 9 1575, Insurance Code. The Health and Human Services Commission
- 10 shall identify the strategies and objectives out of which the
- 11 transfer is to be made.
- 12 (b) The Teacher Retirement System of Texas may use the money
- 13 transferred under Subsection (a) of this section to:
- 14 (1) decrease the premiums and deductibles that would
- 15 otherwise be paid during the 2018 and 2019 plan years by
- 16 participants in the Texas Public School Employees Group Insurance
- 17 Program authorized by Chapter 1575, Insurance Code; and
- 18 (2) reduce costs for an enrolled adult child with a
- 19 mental disability or a physical incapacity during the 2018 and 2019
- 20 plan years.
- 21 (c) The Teacher Retirement System of Texas shall determine
- 22 the most efficient allocation of the money transferred under
- 23 Subsection (a) of this section to achieve the maximum benefit for
- 24 participants in the program.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect only if the 85th
- 26 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 2017, enacts H.B. 21 or another
- 27 similar Act that addresses additional funding under the public

- 1 school finance system for the components described in Section 1 of
- 2 this Act and H.B. 21 or that similar Act becomes law. If H.B. 21 or
- 3 another similar Act described by this section does not become law,
- 4 this Act has no effect.
- 5 SECTION 4. Except as otherwise provided by this Act:
- 6 (1) this Act takes effect immediately if it receives a
- 7 vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution; and
- 9 (2) if this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 10 immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 11 last day of the legislative session.
