A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to signature verification on an early voting ballot voted
3 by mail.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 87.027(i) and (j), Election Code, are 6 amended to read as follows:
- (i) The signature verification committee shall compare the 7 signature on each carrier envelope certificate, except those signed 8 for a voter by a witness, with the signature on the voter's ballot 9 application to determine whether the signatures are those of the 10 11 voter [same person]. The committee may also compare the signatures 12 with any two or more signatures of the voter made within the preceding six years and on file with the general custodian of 13 14 election records or voter registrar [the signature on the voter's registration application] to confirm that the signatures are those 15 16 of the voter and may [same person but may not] use the signatures [registration application signature] to determine that the 17 signatures are not those of the voter [same person]. 18 Except as provided by Subsection (1), a determination under this subsection 19 20 that the signatures are not those of the $\underline{\text{voter}}$ [same person] must be 21 made by a majority vote of the committee's membership. 22 committee shall place the jacket envelopes, carrier envelopes, and 23 applications of voters whose signatures are not those of the voter [same person] in separate containers from those of voters whose 24

- 1 signatures are those of the voter [same person]. The committee
- 2 chair shall deliver the sorted materials to the early voting ballot
- 3 board at the time specified by the board's presiding judge.
- 4 If a signature verification committee is appointed, the 5 early voting ballot board shall follow the same procedure for accepting the early voting ballots voted by mail as in an election 6 without a signature verification committee, except that the board 7 8 may not determine whether a voter's signatures on the carrier envelope certificate and ballot application are those of the voter 9 $[{\color{red} {\sf same \ person}}]$ if the committee has determined that the signatures 10 are those of the voter [same person]. If the committee has 11 12 determined that the signatures are not those of the voter [same person], the board may make a determination that the signatures are 13 14 those of the voter [same person] by a majority vote of the board's 15 membership.
- SECTION 2. Section 87.041(e), Election Code, is amended to read as follows:
- (e) In making the determination under Subsection (b)(2), the board may also compare the signatures with any two or more signatures of the voter made within the preceding six years and on file with the general custodian of election records or voter registrar to determine if [confirm that] the signatures are those of the voter [same person but may not use the signatures to determine that the signatures are not those of the same person].
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
