## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the promotion of breast-feeding and the prohibition
3	against interference with or restriction of the right to
4	breast-feed; creating a civil action.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Sections 165.001 and 165.002, Health and Safety
7	Code, are amended to read as follows:
3	Sec. 165.001. LEGISLATIVE FINDING. The legislature finds

- 8 S that breast-feeding a baby is an important and basic act of nurture 9 that must be encouraged in the interests of maternal and child 10 11 health and family values. In compliance with the breast-feeding 12 promotion program established under the federal Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. Section 1771 et seq.), the legislature 13 14 recognizes breast-feeding as the best method of infant nutrition. The legislature intends for all persons to be informed of the rights 15
- of a breast-feeding mother and child and to be prohibited from interfering with those rights.
- Sec. 165.002. RIGHT TO BREAST-FEED. (a) A mother is
- 19 entitled to breast-feed her baby in any location in which the mother

and the child are otherwise [is] authorized to be on the premises.

- 21 The authorization for the mother and child to be on the premises may
- 22 not be revoked solely because the mother is breast-feeding the
- 23 child.

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24 (b) A person may not interfere with or restrict the right of

- 1 <u>a mother to breast-feed in accordance with this section.</u>
- 2 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 165, Health and Safety
- 3 Code, is amended by adding Section 165.005 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 165.005. STATE AGENCY "MOTHER-FRIENDLY" WORKSITE. To
- 5 the extent reasonably practicable, each state agency shall develop
- 6 <u>a policy supporting the practice of worksite breast-feeding under</u>
- 7 <u>Section 165.003.</u>
- 8 SECTION 3. Chapter 165, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 9 by adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
- 10 SUBCHAPTER C. NOTIFICATION OF RIGHT AND CIVIL CAUSE OF ACTION
- Sec. 165.101. NOTIFICATION BY COMPTROLLER. (a) The
- 12 comptroller at least annually shall include in the comptroller's
- 13 tax policy e-newsletter or otherwise electronically provide
- 14 notification of a mother's right to breast-feed and of the
- 15 prohibition against interference with or restriction of that right
- 16 <u>as provided by Section 165.002.</u>
- 17 (b) The comptroller shall make the notice required by
- 18 Subsection (a) available at each taxpayer seminar offered by the
- 19 office of the comptroller.
- 20 (c) The comptroller may also provide the notification
- 21 required by this section with any other notice or document mailed to
- 22 a person with whom the comptroller communicates.
- Sec. 165.102. CIVIL CAUSE OF ACTION. (a) A mother may
- 24 bring a civil action against a person who is alleged to have
- 25 <u>violated the mother's right to breast-feed a child under Section</u>
- 26 165.002.
- 27 (b) A mother who prevails in an action under this section is

1 entitled to obtain:

- 2 (1) injunctive relief;
- 3 (2) damages in an amount not to exceed \$500 for each
- 4 day a violation of Section 165.002 occurred; and
- 5 (3) reasonable attorney's fees and court costs.
- 6 (c) Notwithstanding any other law, a person liable for
- 7 damages under Subsection (b)(2) is liable for only one damages
- 8 award of \$500 for each day a violation of Section 165.002 occurs,
- 9 and for all violations of Section 165.002 the person commits on that
- 10 day, regardless of the number of violations alleged or the number of
- 11 mothers claiming a violation has occurred. A mother may recover
- 12 only one damages award for each day a violation of Section 165.002
- 13 occurs, regardless of the number of persons who violate that
- 14 section.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 20 legislative session.
