## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 622, Transportation Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter K to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER K. AUTOMOBILE AND BOAT TRANSPORTERS
7	Sec. 622.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Automobile transporter" and "backhaul" have the
9	meanings assigned by 49 U.S.C. Section 31111.
10	(2) "Boat transporter" has the meaning assigned by 23
11	C.F.R. Section 658.5.
12	(3) "Stinger-steered" means a truck-tractor and
13	semitrailer combination in which the fifth wheel is located on a
14	drop frame located behind and below the rearmost axle of the
15	truck-tractor.
16	Sec. 622.152. AUTOMOBILE TRANSPORTER BACKHAULS. An
17	automobile transporter that complies with the weight and size
18	limitations for a truck-tractor and semitrailer combination under
19	this subtitle may transport cargo or general freight on a backhaul.
20	Sec. 622.153. MAXIMUM EXTENDED LENGTH OF LOAD.
21	Notwithstanding Section 621.206, an automobile transporter that is
22	stinger-steered may carry a load that extends not more than:
23	(1) four feet beyond its front; and
24	(2) six feet beyond its rear.

- 1 Sec. 622.154. RULES FOR BOAT TRANSPORTERS. If the United
- 2 States secretary of transportation or the secretary's designee
- 3 adopts regulations regarding the following, the board of the
- 4 department may adopt rules to implement the regulations:

- 1 SECTION 6. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 2 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 3 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is

- 5 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 6 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 7 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 8 before that date.
