4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 34.002(b), Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(b) The task force is a multidisciplinary advisory
8	committee within the department and is composed of the following 16
9	[15] members:
10	(1) $\underline{14}$ [$\underline{13}$] members appointed by the commissioner as
11	follows:
12	(A) four physicians specializing in obstetrics,
13	at least one of whom is a maternal fetal medicine specialist;
14	(B) one certified nurse-midwife;
15	(C) one registered nurse;
16	(D) one nurse specializing in labor and delivery;
17	(E) one physician specializing in family
18	<pre>practice;</pre>
19	$\overline{(\mathtt{F})}$ [$\overline{(\mathtt{E})}$] one physician specializing in
20	psychiatry;
21	$\overline{\text{(G)}}$ [$\overline{\text{(F)}}$] one physician specializing in
22	pathology;
23	$\underline{\text{(H)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(G)}}{\text{(G)}}$] one epidemiologist, biostatistician,
24	or researcher of pregnancy-related deaths;

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- 1 (I) $\left[\frac{\text{(H)}}{\text{(H)}}\right]$ one social worker or social service
- 2 provider;
- $\underline{(J)}$ [$\underline{(I)}$] one community advocate in a relevant
- 4 field; and
- 5 $(K) \left[\frac{J}{J}\right]$ one medical examiner or coroner
- 6 responsible for recording deaths;
- 7 (2) a representative of the department's family and
- 8 community health programs; and
- 9 (3) the state epidemiologist for the department or the
- 10 epidemiologist's designee.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 16 legislative session.
