5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 11, Tax Code, is amended by
7	adding Section 11.139 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 11.139. RESIDENCE HOMESTEAD OF ELIGIBLE PEACE OFFICER
9	RESIDING IN QUALIFIED HIGH CRIME AREA. (a) In this section:
10	(1) "Eligible peace officer" means an individual
11	listed under Article 2.12(1), (2), (3), or (4), Code of Criminal
12	Procedure, who is employed full-time as a peace officer by this

- state or by a political subdivision of this state. 13 (2) "Qualified high crime area" means a census tract 14
- delineated by the United States Bureau of the Census in the most 15 16 recent decennial census that is one of the 100 census tracts in this
- state with the highest per capita rate of arrests made for offenses 17 under Title 5, Penal Code, as determined under Subsection (b).
- (3) "Residence homestead" has the meaning assigned by 19 <u>Section 1</u>1.13. 20
- 21 (b) Not later than September 1 of each year, the Department of Public Safety shall: 22
- 23 (1) perform an analysis of crime statistics for the 24 preceding tax year and identify the 100 census tracts in this state

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- 1 with the highest number of per capita arrests made for offenses
- 2 under Title 5, Penal Code; and
- 3 (2) publish a list of the identified census tracts in
- 4 the Texas Register.
- 5 (c) An eligible peace officer is entitled to an exemption
- 6 from taxation of the total appraised value of the officer's
- 7 residence homestead if the residence homestead is located in a
- 8 qualified high crime area.
- 9 SECTION 2. (a) Section 11.139, Tax Code, as added by this
- 10 Act, applies only to ad valorem taxes imposed for a tax year
- 11 beginning on or after January 1, 2019.
- 12 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall perform the
- 13 initial analysis required by Section 11.139, Tax Code, as added by
- 14 this Act, and publish the list required by that section not later
- 15 than September 1, 2018.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 2018, but only
- 17 if the constitutional amendment proposed by the 85th Legislature,
- 18 1st Called Session, 2017, authorizing the legislature to exempt
- 19 from ad valorem taxation all or part of the market value of the
- 20 residence homestead of a peace officer who resides in a high crime
- 21 area is approved by the voters. If that constitutional amendment is
- 22 not approved by the voters, this Act has no effect.
