A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to maternal health care.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 32, Health and Safety
5	Code, is amended by adding Section 32.022 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 32.022. WOMEN'S HEALTH CAMPAIGN. The commission, in
7	collaboration with the department and other interested parties,
8	shall create a campaign to educate women about the importance of
9	prenatal care.
10	SECTION 2. Section 34.005, Health and Safety Code, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	Sec. 34.005. DUTIES OF TASK FORCE. The task force shall:
13	(1) study and review:
14	(A) cases of pregnancy-related deaths; [and]
15	(B) trends <u>,</u> rates, or disparities in
16	pregnancy-related deaths, postpartum depression, behavioral health
17	diagnoses, and [in] severe maternal morbidity;
18	(C) health conditions and factors that
19	disproportionately affect the most at-risk population as
20	determined in the task force's biennial report required under
21	Section 34.015; and
22	(D) best practices and programs operating in
23	other states that have reduced rates of pregnancy-related deaths;
24	(2) determine the feasibility of the task force

- 1 studying cases of severe maternal morbidity; and
- 2 (3) make recommendations to help reduce the incidence
- 3 of pregnancy-related deaths and severe maternal morbidity in this
- 4 state.
- 5 SECTION 3. Chapter 34, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Sections 34.0155, 34.0156, and 34.0157 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 34.0155. REPORT ON PREGNANCY-RELATED DEATHS AND
- 8 POSTPARTUM DEPRESSION. The commission shall:
- 9 (1) evaluate options for reducing pregnancy-related
- 10 deaths, focusing on the most prevalent causes of pregnancy-related
- 11 deaths as identified in the task force's biennial report required
- 12 under Section 34.015, and for treating postpartum depression in
- 13 economically disadvantaged women; and
- 14 (2) submit a written report summarizing the
- 15 commission's, department's, and task force's efforts to accomplish
- 16 the tasks described by Subdivision (1) to the governor, the
- 17 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 18 the Legislative Budget Board, and the appropriate standing
- 19 committees of the legislature not later than December 1 of each
- 20 even-numbered year.
- 21 <u>Sec. 34.0156. REPORT ON ACTIONS TO ADDRESS MATERNAL</u>
- 22 MORTALITY RATES. Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered
- 23 year, the commission shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant
- 24 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the
- 25 Legislative Budget Board, and the appropriate standing committees
- 26 of the legislature a written report summarizing the actions taken
- 27 to address maternal morbidity and reduce maternal mortality rates.

- 1 The report must include information from programs and initiatives
- 2 created to address maternal morbidity and reduce maternal mortality
- 3 rates in this state, including:
- 4 (1) Medicaid as defined by Section 531.001, Government
- 5 Code;
- 6 (2) the children's health insurance program, including
- 7 the perinatal program;
- 8 (3) the Healthy Texas Women program;
- 9 (4) the Family Planning Program;
- 10 (5) this state's program under the Maternal and Child
- 11 Health Services Block Grant Act (42 U.S.C. Section 701 et seq.);
- 12 (6) the Perinatal Advisory Council;
- 13 (7) state health plans; and
- 14 (8) the Healthy Texas Babies program.
- 15 Sec. 34.0157. PROGRAM EVALUATIONS; RESOURCE GUIDE; PILOT
- 16 PROGRAM. (a) The task force, under the direction of the
- 17 commission, shall:
- 18 (1) explore options for expanding the pilot program
- 19 for pregnancy medical homes under Section 531.0996, Government
- 20 Code;
- 21 (2) explore the possibility of increasing the benefits
- 22 provided under state-administered health programs, including
- 23 specialty care and prescriptions, for women who are at greater risk
- 24 of having a high-risk pregnancy or premature delivery;
- 25 (3) evaluate supplemental payments to obstetrics
- 26 providers for pregnancy risk assessments and evaluate the
- 27 submission of a waiver to fund managed care organization payments

- 1 for case management and care coordination services for women at
- 2 high risk of severe maternal morbidity on conclusion of their
- 3 eligibility for Medicaid as defined by Section 531.001, Government
- 4 Code;
- 5 (4) evaluate the length of time to complete the
- 6 Medicaid enrollment process for pregnant women;
- 7 (5) evaluate the use for Medicaid of Medicare codes
- 8 for care coordination; and
- 9 (6) study the impact of the programs funded from the
- 10 Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program federal grant and whether the
- 11 state should continue funding the programs.
- 12 (b) The commission shall:
- 13 (1) create and maintain an online resource guide of
- 14 mental and behavioral health providers to assist women who have
- 15 <u>limited or no health benefit plan coverage or mental health benefit</u>
- 16 plan coverage in finding affordable providers; and
- 17 (2) create a pilot program for managed care
- 18 organizations to use community health workers to address the needs
- 19 of women who have a high-risk condition, including:
- 20 (A) substance use disorder;
- 21 <u>(B) cardiovascular disease; and</u>
- (C) hypertension.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 34, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Section 34.019 to read as follows:
- Sec. 34.019. DATA COLLECTION. The task force, under the
- 26 direction of the commission, shall collect information relating to
- 27 maternity care and postpartum depression in this state, including

1 th<u>e:</u> 2 (1) total number of births to Medicaid recipients; (2) number of women who are screened for postpartum 3 depression as a Medicaid recipient; 4 5 (3) total number of births to women with health benefit plan coverage; 6 7 (4) number of women with health benefit plan coverage 8 who are screened for postpartum depression; (5) number of women with health benefit plan coverage 9 10 who are treated for postpartum depression; (6) number of women screened for postpartum depression 11 12 under the Healthy Texas Women program; (7) number of women treated for postpartum depression 13 14 under the Healthy Texas Women program; 15 (8) number of claims for postpartum depression treatment paid by the Healthy Texas Women program; 16 17 (9) number of claims for postpartum depression treatment rejected by the Healthy Texas Women program; 18 19 (10) postpartum depression screening and treatment billing codes and the number of claims for each billing code under 20 21 the Healthy Texas Women program; 22 (11) number of days between the date of a postpartum depression screening and the date the patient begins treatment 23 24 under Medicaid; 25 (12) number of days between the date of a postpartum 26 depression screening and the date the patient begins treatment

under the Healthy Texas Women program;

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- 1 (13) number of women who screen positive for
- 2 postpartum depression under Medicaid and the length of time
- 3 following childbirth for the screening to occur;
- 4 (14) number of women with health benefit plan coverage
- 5 who screen positive for postpartum depression and the length of
- 6 time following childbirth for the screening to occur; and
- 7 (15) number of women who screen positive for
- 8 postpartum depression under the Healthy Texas Women program and the
- 9 length of time following childbirth for the screening to occur.
- 10 SECTION 5. Section 34.018, Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 34.018. SUNSET PROVISION. The task force is subject to
- 13 Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued
- 14 in existence as provided by that chapter, the task force is
- abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2023 [2019].
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 21 legislative session.
