## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the adoption of teacher performance contracts for
- 3 classroom teachers and an increased basic allotment for school
- 4 districts that adopt those contracts.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 21, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 7 Subchapter H-1 to read as follows:
- 8 SUBCHAPTER H-1. TEACHER PERFORMANCE CONTRACTS
- 9 Sec. 21.371. TEACHER PERFORMANCE CONTRACTS. (a) A school
- 10 district may adopt teacher performance contracts under this
- 11 subchapter for use in the district for the purpose of providing
- 12 specific guidance to classroom teachers on improving performance.
- 13 (b) A district that adopts teacher performance contracts
- 14 under this subchapter must use a teacher performance contract
- 15 evaluation system described by Section 21.372.
- 16 (c) A teacher performance contract under this subchapter is
- 17 a supplemental agreement between the district and teacher and does
- 18 not affect the requirements under this chapter to employ a teacher
- 19 under a probationary, continuing, or term contract.
- 20 Sec. 21.372. TEACHER PERFORMANCE CONTRACT EVALUATION
- 21 SYSTEM. (a) A teacher performance contract evaluation system
- 22 consists of an appraisal process and performance criteria adopted
- 23 in accordance with Section 21.352(a)(2) that include evaluation
- 24 based on:

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- 1 (1) observation of the teacher's performance;
- 2 (2) student achievement results, as measured by
- 3 student growth and performance on multiple tests and school growth
- 4 and performance on state assessment instruments administered under
- 5 Section 39.023; and
- 6 (3) research-based, age-appropriate surveys
- 7 administered to students about the teacher's performance.
- 8 <u>(b) The evaluation system described by this section must</u>
- 9 provide that a classroom teacher's performance on each criteria
- 10 listed in Subsection (a)(1), (2), or (3) is weighted not less than
- 11 15 percent of the teacher's appraisal.
- 12 (c) The evaluation system described by this section must
- 13 provide not fewer than eight performance levels to which a
- 14 classroom teacher may be assigned based on the teacher's appraisal.
- 15 Sec. 21.373. ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION BASED ON APPRAISAL
- 16 PERFORMANCE LEVEL. (a) A teacher performance contract must
- 17 provide for additional compensation for a classroom teacher
- 18 assigned a performance level under the evaluation system described
- 19 by Section 21.372 that indicates the teacher's performance exceeds
- 20 the performance expected at the teacher's level of experience.
- 21 (b) The contract must ensure that the salary of a teacher
- 22 <u>described by Subsection (a) exceeds the compensation the teacher is</u>
- 23 entitled to under the minimum salary schedule provided by Section
- 24 21.402.
- Sec. 21.374. CERTAIN EMPLOYMENT RENEWAL PROHIBITED. (a) A
- 26 school district that adopts teacher performance contracts under
- 27 this subchapter may not renew the employment contract of a

- 1 classroom teacher employed under a probationary contract who is
- 2 assigned the minimum performance level based on the teacher's
- 3 appraisal for the school year, except as otherwise provided by
- 4 Subsection (b).
- 5 (b) The board of trustees of a school district may take
- 6 specific action to renew the employment of a teacher who is employed
- 7 under a probationary contract and is assigned the minimum
- 8 performance level based on the teacher's appraisal for the school
- 9 year.
- Sec. 21.375. COMMISSIONER APPROVAL. The commissioner shall
- 11 approve a school district for purposes of the adjustment in the
- 12 district's basic allotment provided by Section 42.101(d) if the
- 13 commissioner determines that:
- 14 (1) the district has met the requirements for teacher
- 15 performance contracts provided by this subchapter; and
- 16 (2) the teacher performance contracts adopted by the
- 17 district satisfy any commissioner rules adopted to ensure that
- 18 teacher performance contracts are likely to improve the district's:
- 19 (A) recruitment of effective classroom teachers;
- 20 (B) retention of effective classroom teachers;
- 21 <u>and</u>
- (C) student performance.
- Sec. 21.376. RULES. The commissioner may adopt rules to
- 24 implement this subchapter.
- 25 SECTION 2. Section 42.101, Education Code, is amended by
- 26 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 27 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,

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- 1 for a school district that adopts teacher performance contracts
- 2 under Subchapter H-1, Chapter 21, and receives commissioner
- 3 approval under Section 21.375, the basic allotment to which the
- 4 district would otherwise be entitled under this section is
- 5 increased by the amount that results from the following formula:
- $\underline{I} = \$50 \text{ X (PCE/TE)}$
- 7 where:
- 8 <u>"I" is the amount by which the district's basic allotment is</u>
- 9 increased under this subsection;
- 10 <u>"PCE" is the number of classroom teachers employed by the</u>
- 11 district that have entered a teacher performance contract with the
- 12 district; and
- "TE" is the total number of classroom teachers employed by
- 14 the district.
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2018-2019
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect December 1, 2017.
