H.J.R. No. 44

A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature  
2 to exempt from ad valorem taxation all or part of the market value  
3 of the residence homestead of a peace officer who resides in a high  
4 crime area.

5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 1-b, Article VIII, Texas Constitution,  
7 is amended by adding Subsection (t) to read as follows:

8 (t) The legislature by general law may exempt from ad  
9 valorem taxation all or part of the market value of the residence  
10 homestead of a peace officer who resides in a high crime area. The  
11 legislature by general law may define "high crime area" and "peace  
12 officer" for purposes of this subsection and may provide additional  
13 eligibility requirements for the exemption authorized by this  
14 subsection.

15 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to  
16 the Texas Constitution:

17 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies  
18 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 85th Legislature,  
19 1st Called Session, 2017, authorizing the legislature to exempt  
20 from ad valorem taxation all or part of the market value of the  
21 residence homestead of a peace officer who resides in a high crime  
22 area.

23 (b) Section 1-b(t), Article VIII, of this constitution  
24 takes effect January 1, 2019, and applies only to ad valorem taxes

1 imposed for a tax year beginning on or after that date.

2 (c) This temporary provision expires January 1, 2020.

3 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be  
4 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 7, 2017.  
5 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the  
6 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the  
7 legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation all or part of the  
8 market value of the residence homestead of a peace officer who  
9 resides in a high crime area."
