1 WHEREAS, The life of an esteemed musician and educator drew 2 to a close with the passing of Edward G. Olivares of Corpus Christi 3 on June 21, 2017, at the age of 86; and

WHEREAS, Eddie Olivares was born to Audelio and Susana 4 5 Olivares on February 28, 1931, in Mercedes, and he grew up with the companionship of six siblings; his brother gave him his first 6 7 trumpet when he was 12, and by the age of 14 he was playing in dance bands; a 1949 graduate of Corpus Christi High School, Mr. Olivares 8 9 continued his education at Del Mar College, earning an associate degree in 1952; he then served for two years in the U.S. Army, where 10 11 he played in the band and the jazz orchestra; and

12 WHEREAS, Following his return to civilian life, Mr. Olivares 13 earned bachelor's and master's degrees in music at The University of 14 Texas at Austin; he began his career in education at Lamar Junior High School in Laredo; seeking more opportunities to play live 15 16 music, he moved back to Corpus Christi, accepting a teaching position at Sundeen Junior High; in 1967, he became band director at 17 Moody High School, a post he held until 1975, and over the 18 succeeding years, he worked as a counselor at Carroll High, King 19 20 High, and Del Mar College before retiring in 1995; he also directed 21 the Texas A&M University--Corpus Christi jazz ensemble from 2002 to 2007; and 22

23 WHEREAS, Mr. Olivares gave generously of his time and talents 24 to a number of music organizations, including the American

1 Federation of Musicians Local 644 and the Corpus Christi Symphony Orchestra, Municipal Band, and Arts Council; moreover, he helped 2 found the Texas Jazz Festival, served as choir director at Christ 3 the King Church and St. Patrick Church, and started the jazz mass at 4 5 Holy Cross Church; in recognition of his many accomplishments, he was inducted into the Texas Music Educators Association Region XIV 6 Band Directors Hall of Fame and the Water Street Market South Texas 7 8 Music Walk of Fame; and

9 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Olivares enjoyed the love 10 and support of his wife, Emilie; he was the proud father of four 11 children, Edward, Paul, Mary, and Michael, and he also treasured 12 the time he spent with his grandson, David; and

WHEREAS, Although he is greatly missed, Eddie Olivares has left his family and friends with many cherished memories, and he will forever hold a special place in their hearts; now, therefore, be it
