1 WHEREAS, Marilyn Hinton concluded her terms as the Place 6
2 representative on the Plano Independent School District Board of
3 Trustees in 2017, following eight years of notable service; and

4 WHEREAS, Ms. Hinton was first elected to the board in 2009,
5 and during her tenure she worked closely with parents, teachers,
6 administrators, and other concerned citizens to foster a supportive
7 and challenging environment at district schools; she further
8 distinguished herself through her role as secretary of the board;

11 bachelor's degree in speech and drama from Fisk University and a
12 master's degree in education from Howard University; she has long
13 been a vital asset to the district, previously working as a teacher

16 Committee and two school-based improvement committees; in
17 addition, she has served as a visiting scholar at Brookhaven
18 College, a counselor and adjunct professor at Richland College, and
19 a youth director at a nonprofit agency for homeless and
20 transitional families; and

21 WHEREAS, This esteemed educator is also a graduate of
22 Leadership Plano, and she has served on the boards of The Samaritan
23 Inn, the Plano Metro Rotary Club, and Character.org; moreover, she
24 has held membership with the Plano Symphony Orchestra Virtuoso

1 Society and Jack and Jill of America, Inc., and served as a
2 volunteer with the Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County and
3 as a Sunday school teacher; in recognition of her many
4 contributions to her community, she was presented with a 2012 Women
5 of Excellence Award by the Plano Community Forum; she is supported
6 in all her endeavors by the love and encouragement of her husband,
7 Jim, and their two daughters; and

8 WHEREAS, The people of Plano have benefited immeasurably from
9 Marilyn Hinton's vision and leadership, and her fine work has
10 helped provide countless local students with a strong academic
11 foundation on which to build a bright and prosperous future; now,
12 therefore, be it

14 Legislature, 1st Called Session, hereby commend Marilyn Hinton on
15 her service as a member of the Plano Independent School District
16 Board of Trustees and extend to her sincere best wishes for the
