## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The State of Texas lost a celebrated entrepreneur 2 with the passing of Lonnie "Bo" Pilgrim of Pittsburg on July 21, 3 2017, at the age of 89; and

WHEREAS, Born in Pine on May 8, 1928, Bo Pilgrim was the son of Alonzo Monroe Pilgrim and Gertrude Gunn Pilgrim; his father died when he was a boy, and he went to live with his paternal grandmother; after working as a farmhand and performing other manual labor, he accepted an offer to partner with an older brother, Aubrey, in ownership of a feed store; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pilgrim served his country in the United States 10 11 Army, and while stationed in California, he was impressed by its enormous feed operations; on his return to Texas, he guided 12 investment in larger facilities, and the Pilgrim family company 13 14 expanded into chicken products and became a major egg producer; he took charge of Pilgrim's Pride following the death of his brother in 15 16 1966, and while continuing to expand the business, he directed innovative efforts to make its products leaner and healthier; a 17 savvy marketer, he gained national recognition by appearing in 18 commercials, sporting a pilgrim's buckled hat; the company became 19 20 one of the area's largest employers and one of the world's foremost poultry producers; he retired in 2010, having spent more than four 21 decades building a company that today employs 35,000; and 22

23 WHEREAS, Highly engaged in the civic sphere, Mr. Pilgrim 24 worked at the state level to promote a positive business

1 environment, and his dedication to East Texas was reflected in his founding of Pilgrim Bank, which he continued to serve as chair 2 3 emeritus until his death; a man of deep faith, he was a congregant at First Baptist Church, where he taught Sunday school for many 4 5 years, and he spread the gospel widely by handing out religious tracts; moreover, he established Marketplace Ministries, a 6 workplace outreach, created Witness Park as a place of prayer and 7 8 fellowship in the center of Pittsburg, and supported the completion of Pilgrim Plaza, a one-acre site for contemplation and community 9 10 gatherings; his bountiful philanthropic giving made a positive difference in countless lives; and 11

WHEREAS, Mr. Pilgrim shared a fulfilling marriage of 61 years 12 with his wife, Patty R. Pilgrim; he was the devoted father of three 13 14 children, Ken, Pat, and Greta, and his family also included his 15 grandchildren, Clayton, Jake, and Lonnie Pilgrim, Greta Gail Chesley Hindman, and Shelby 16 Simpson, Owens, and his 17 great-grandchildren, Kate, Emily, and Gracie Hindman; and

WHEREAS, Although his vision, work ethic, and business expertise brought him tremendous professional success, Bo Pilgrim placed the highest value on family, faith, and community, and those who were privileged to know him will continue to find inspiration in his example of generosity and humble appreciation for his blessings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas Legislature, 1st Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of Bo Pilgrim and extend sincere condolences to his loved ones; and, be it further
