## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Under the leadership of Fire Chief John Phillips, 2 members of the Morgan's Point Resort Volunteer Fire Department 3 acted swiftly and decisively to contain a fast-moving brush fire 4 near Lake Belton on July 27, 2017; and

5 WHEREAS, Stoked by dry conditions in the area, the blaze 6 started in the early evening and went on to consume around five 7 acres in Morgan's Point Resort, where it threatened nearby homes 8 and forced the evacuation of local residents; and

WHEREAS, In its efforts to control the fire, the Morgan's 9 Point Resort Volunteer Fire Department was assisted by agencies 10 11 from throughout Bell County, including the Temple Police 12 Department, Temple Fire & Rescue, the Bell County Sheriff's Department, and the Texas Department of Public Safety; firefighters 13 14 worked with police to shut down roads and warn residents, and members of the Texas A&M Forest Service helped them in creating fire 15 16 breaks to halt the spread of the flames; thanks in large part to the expert coordination of these first responders, the crisis was 17 successfully resolved in a matter of hours with no injuries or 18 property damage reported; and 19

WHEREAS, The heroic response of Chief John Phillips and his crew saved lives and spared dozens of homes in the area from destruction, and their tireless dedication to public safety has set a high standard of excellence to which others in their profession may aspire; now, therefore, be it
