S.B. No. 19

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to bonuses for public school classroom teachers and state
- 3 assistance for the Texas Public School Employees Group Insurance
- 4 Program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 21.417 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 21.417. CLASSROOM TEACHER STATE CAREER BONUS.
- 9 (a) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for
- 10 purposes of this section, the agency shall provide an annual bonus
- 11 to each classroom teacher with at least six years of teaching
- 12 experience at the beginning of the school year during which the
- 13 bonus is provided.
- 14 (b) The amount of the bonus provided to each classroom
- 15 teacher during any school year shall be established by
- 16 appropriation, and the appropriation may provide for different
- 17 bonus amounts during a school year based on the number of years of
- 18 teaching experience.
- 19 <u>(c) A bonus provided to a classroom teacher under this</u>
- 20 <u>section is not considered in determining whether a school district</u>
- 21 is paying the teacher the minimum monthly salary under Section
- 22 21.402.
- 23 (d) The agency shall provide a bonus under this section only
- 24 to a person employed as a classroom teacher at the time the bonus is

paid. 1

SECTION 2. (a)

- 2 The amount of \$193,000,000 of the unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund for the 3 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, made by S.B. 1, Acts 4 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General 5 Appropriations Act), to the Health and Human Services Commission is 6 7 transferred to the Texas Education Agency to be used by the agency
- to provide the following bonuses to public school classroom 8
- 9 teachers under Section 21.417, Education Code, as added by this
- 10 Act:
- 11 (1)a bonus of \$600 to be paid in September 2018 for
- each classroom teacher with at least 6 but less than 11 years of 12
- teaching experience at the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year; 13
- 14 and
- 15 a bonus of \$1,000 to be paid in September 2018 for
- 16 each classroom teacher with at least 11 years of teaching
- experience at the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year. 17
- The Health and Human Services Commission shall identify 18
- the strategies and objectives out of which the transfer under 19
- Subsection (a) of this section is to be made. 20
- SECTION 3. (a) The \$212,000,000 21 amount of
- unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund for the 22
- state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, made by S.B. 1, Acts 23
- 24 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
- 25 Appropriations Act), to the Health and Human Services Commission is
- transferred to the Teacher Retirement System of Texas and may be 26
- 27 used by the retirement system during that state fiscal biennium to

- 1 provide support to participants in the Texas Public School
- 2 Employees Group Insurance Program authorized by Chapter 1575,
- 3 Insurance Code. The Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 4 identify the strategies and objectives out of which the transfer is
- 5 to be made.
- 6 (b) The Teacher Retirement System of Texas may use the money
- 7 transferred under Subsection (a) of this section to:
- 8 (1) reduce costs for participants, including
- 9 premiums, deductibles, and prescription drugs, during the 2018 and
- 10 2019 plan years; and
- 11 (2) reduce the premium and maximum out-of-pocket cost
- 12 for an enrolled adult child with a mental disability or a physical
- 13 incapacity during the 2018 and 2019 plan years.
- 14 (c) The Teacher Retirement System of Texas shall determine
- 15 the most efficient allocation of the money transferred under
- 16 Subsection (a) of this section to achieve the maximum benefit for
- 17 participants in the program.
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 21.417, Education Code, as added by this
- 19 Act, applies beginning with the 2018-2019 school year.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 25 legislative session.
