## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the participation of a charitable organization that
- facilitates the procurement of an elective abortion in the state 3
- employee charitable campaign. 4
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 659.146, Government Code, is amended by
- amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (h) to read as 7
- follows: 8

- To be eligible to participate in a state employee 9 (a)
- charitable campaign, a charitable organization must: 10
- 11 (1) be governed by a voluntary board of citizens that
- 12 meets at least twice each year to set policy and manage the affairs
- of the organization; 13
- 14 (2) if the organization's annual budget:
- 15 does not exceed \$250,000, provide a completed
- 16 Internal Revenue Service Form 990 and an accountant's review that
- 17 offers full and open disclosure of the organization's internal
- operations; or 18
- exceeds \$250,000, be audited annually in 19 (B)
- accordance with generally accepted auditing standards of the 20
- 21 American Institute of Certified Public Accountants; [and]
- 22 (3) not spend more than 25 percent of its annual
- 23 revenue for administrative and fund-raising expenses; and
- 24 (4) not directly or indirectly facilitate

- 1 procurement of an elective abortion.
- 2 (h) In this section, "elective abortion" means, for a female
- 3 known by an attending physician to be pregnant, the intentional
- 4 termination of the pregnancy using any means reasonably likely to
- 5 cause the death of the fetus. The term does not include the
- 6 termination of a pregnancy:
- 7 (1) that resulted from an act of rape or incest;
- 8 (2) for a female who suffers from a physical disorder,
- 9 disability, or illness, including a life-threatening physical
- 10 condition caused by or arising from the pregnancy, that, as
- 11 certified by a physician, places the female in danger of death or
- 12 risk of substantial impairment of a major bodily function unless an
- 13 abortion is performed; or
- 14 (3) that involves a fetus with a life-threatening
- 15 physical condition that, in reasonable medical judgment and
- 16 regardless of the provision of lifesaving treatment, is
- 17 incompatible with life outside the womb.
- SECTION 2. Not later than April 1, 2018, the state employee
- 19 charitable campaign policy committee shall modify the guidelines
- 20 established under Section 659.146(f), Government Code, for
- 21 evaluating the applications of charitable organizations to be
- 22 consistent with the changes in law made by this Act. The state
- 23 employee charitable campaign policy committee shall exclude from
- 24 participation in a state employee charitable campaign any
- 25 charitable organization that does not meet the modified guidelines.
- 26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect December 1, 2017.
