- 1 on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 2018, but only
- 3 if the constitutional amendment proposed by the 85th Legislature,
- 4 1st Called Session, 2017, to authorize the legislature to set a
- 5 lower limit on the maximum appraised value of a residence homestead
- 6 for ad valorem taxation is approved by the voters. If that
- 7 amendment is not approved by the voters, this Act has no effect.
