AUTHOR'S / SPONSOR'S STATEMENT OF INTENT

Currently, political subdivisions like cities and counties may direct requestors of public information to a website if the information already exists online. However, state agencies must provide original copies for inspection, make duplications, and/or send the information by first class mail, all of which expend valuable time and resources.

- S.B. 79 streamlines access to public information by allowing state agencies to respond to information requests with an Internet address where requested information may already exist. (Original Author's / Sponsor's Statement of Intent)
- S.B. 79 amends current law relating to the production of public information available on a publicly accessible website.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

- SECTION 1. Amends Sections 552.221(b-1) and (b-2), Government Code, as follows:
 - (b-1) Changes references from a political subdivision of this state to a governmental body in regards to public information maintained on a website.
 - (b-2) Makes conforming changes.
- SECTION 2. Makes application of this Act prospective.
- SECTION 3. Effective date: September 1, 2017.
