A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the entitlement of spouses of certain veterans with disabilities to a veteran's employment preference. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 657.002, Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 657.002. INDIVIDUALS 7 QUALIFIED FOR VETERAN'S EMPLOYMENT PREFERENCE. The following individuals qualify for a 8 9 veteran's employment preference: (1) a veteran, including a veteran with a disability; 10 11 (2) a veteran's surviving spouse who has not 12 remarried; [and] 13 (3) an orphan of a veteran if the veteran was killed 14 while on active duty; and 15 (4) the spouse of a veteran with a disability who has a 16 total disability rating based either on having a service-connected disability with a disability rating of 100 percent or on individual 17 unemployability and who is receiving Supplemental Security Income 18 (SSI) benefits under 42 U.S.C. Section 1381 et seq. or Social 19 Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits under 42 U.S.C. 20 Section 401 et seq., if the spouse was married to the veteran at the 21 time the veteran separated from the armed services. 22 23 SECTION 2. Section 657.003(b), Government Code, is amended

1 (b) A state agency shall provide to an individual entitled to a veteran's employment preference for employment or appointment 2 3 over other applicants for the same position who do not have a greater qualification a veteran's employment preference, in the 4 5 following order of priority: 6 (1) a veteran with a disability; 7 (2) a veteran; 8 (3) a spouse of a veteran with a disability as described by Section 657.002(4); 9 veteran's surviving spouse 10 <u>(4)</u> a who has not remarried; and 11 12 (5) [(4)] an orphan of a veteran if the veteran was killed while on active duty. 13 14 SECTION 3. Section 657.005(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 16 (b) An applicant who is <u>either</u> a veteran with a disability 17 or a spouse of a veteran with a disability as described by Section 657.002(4) shall furnish the official records to the individual 18 whose duty is to fill the position. 19 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 20 21 an open position with a state agency for which the state agency begins accepting applications on or after the effective date of 22 23 this Act. An open position with a state agency for which the state 24 agency begins accepting applications before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the state 25 26 agency began accepting applications, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 27
