- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 54.0514 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 54.0514. LIMITATION ON TOTAL AMOUNT OF TUITION. (a)
- 8 <u>In this section, "tuition" includes:</u>
- 9 (1) tuition for which the rates are prescribed by this
- 10 chapter; and

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- 11 (2) tuition charged by an institution of higher
- 12 education under Section 54.0513 or another law authorizing an
- 13 institution to establish tuition rates.
- 14 (b) The total amount of tuition charged by an institution of
- 15 higher education to a student for an academic year may not exceed an
- 16 amount equal to 85 percent of the total amount of tuition that the
- 17 <u>institution would have charged under this chapter to a similarly</u>
- 18 situated student for the 2016-2017 academic year. For purposes of
- 19 this subsection, students are similarly situated if they share the
- 20 same residency status, degree program, course load, course level,
- 21 tuition exemption status, and other circumstances affecting the
- 22 <u>tuition charged to the student. This subsection does not ensure</u>
- 23 that the total amount of tuition charged to an individual student
- 24 does not increase based on a change in the student's residency

- 1 status, degree program, course load, course level, tuition
- 2 exemption status, or other circumstance affecting the tuition
- 3 charged to the student.
- 4 SECTION 2. Sections 54.0513(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) In addition to amounts that a governing board of an
- 7 institution of higher education is authorized to charge as tuition
- 8 under the other provisions of this chapter, the governing board[$_{ au}$
- 9 under the terms the governing board considers appropriate, and
- 10 charge any student an amount designated as tuition <u>not to exceed the</u>
- 11 amount that enables the institution to comply with Section 54.0514
- 12 that the governing board considers necessary for the effective
- 13 operation of the institution.
- 14 (b) Subject to the limit provided by Subsection (a) on the
- 15 amount designated as tuition charged under this section, a [A]
- 16 governing board may set a different tuition rate <u>under this section</u>
- 17 for each program and course level offered by each institution of
- 18 higher education[. A governing board may set a different tuition
- 19 rate] as the governing board considers appropriate to increase
- 20 graduation rates, encourage efficient use of facilities, [or]
- 21 enhance employee performance, or further another legitimate
- 22 purpose of the institution.
- SECTION 3. Sections 54.0515(e) and (f), Education Code, are
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- 25 (e) It is the legislature's intent that each institution of
- 26 higher education[, as a condition to tuition deregulation under
- 27 Section 54.0513, reasonably implement the following:

- 1 (1) each institution shall make satisfactory progress
- 2 towards the goals provided in its master plan for higher education
- 3 and in "Closing the Gaps," the state's master plan for higher
- 4 education; and
- 5 (2) each institution shall meet acceptable
- 6 performance criteria, including measures such as graduation rates,
- 7 retention rates, enrollment growth, educational quality, efforts
- 8 to enhance minority participation, opportunities for financial
- 9 aid, and affordability.
- 10 (f) The committee shall:
- 11 (1) meet at the call of either chair;
- 12 (2) monitor and regularly report to the legislature on
- 13 each institution of higher education's compliance with the
- 14 requirements of Subsection (e); and
- 15 (3) receive and review information concerning the
- 16 affordability and accessibility of higher education[, including
- 17 the impact of tuition deregulation].
- 18 SECTION 4. (a) This Act applies beginning with tuition
- 19 charged by public institutions of higher education for the 2017
- 20 fall semester. Tuition charged by an institution of higher
- 21 education in an academic period before that semester is covered by
- 22 the law in effect before the effective date of this Act, and the
- 23 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- (b) If before the effective date of this Act a student has
- 25 paid an amount of tuition for the 2017 fall semester in excess of
- 26 the maximum amount permitted by Section 54.0514, Education Code, as
- 27 added by this Act, the institution the student attends shall refund

- 1 to the student the excess amount of tuition paid.
- 2 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
