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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the consideration of the performance of students of 3 limited English proficiency on state assessment instruments and 4 inclusion of related information in campus report cards.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 39.027(a-2), Education Code, is amended
to read as follows:

8 (a-2) Unless a student is enrolled in a school in the United 9 States for a period of at least <u>120</u> [60] consecutive days during a 10 year, the student may not be considered to be enrolled in a school 11 in the United States for that year for the purpose of determining a 12 number of years under Subsection (a)(1), (2), or (3).

13 SECTION 2. Section 39.054, Education Code, is amended by 14 adding Subsections (d) and (d-1) to read as follows:

(d) Except as provided by Subsection (d-1), in evaluating 15 performance under Subsection (c), the commissioner may not lower a 16 performance rating for purposes of this chapter based on 17 unsatisfactory performance on an assessment instrument 18 administered under Section 39.023 to a student for a period of two 19 years after the student's initial enrollment in a school in the 20 United States if the student is a student of limited English 21 proficiency, as defined by Section 29.052. This subsection does 22 23 not apply to a performance rating for purposes of:

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(1) compliance monitoring under Section 7.028; or

2	(d-1) Subsection (d) does not apply if the assessment
3	instrument administered to a student of limited English proficiency
4	is in the student's native language.
5	SECTION 3. Section 39.305(b), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(b) The report card shall include the following
8	information:
9	(1) where applicable, the achievement indicators
10	described by Section 39.053(c) and the reporting indicators
11	<pre>described by Sections 39.301(c)(1) through (5);</pre>
12	(2) average class size by grade level and subject;
13	(3) the administrative and instructional costs per
14	student, computed in a manner consistent with Section 44.0071;
15	[and]
16	(4) the district's instructional expenditures ratio
17	and instructional employees ratio computed under Section 44.0071,
18	and the statewide average of those ratios, as determined by the
19	commissioner; and
20	(5) the performance of students of limited English
21	proficiency, as defined by Section 29.052, on assessment
22	instruments administered under Section 39.023.
23	SECTION 4. Section 39.027(a-2), Education Code, as amended
24	by this Act, and Section 39.054(d), Education Code, as added by this
25	Act, apply to a student regardless of the date on which the student
26	initially enrolled in a school in the United States.
27	SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
