## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to education programs regarding AIDS and HIV infection. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 85.007(c), Health and Safety Code, is 4 5 amended to read as follows: In addition, the educational materials intended for 6 (c) 7 persons younger than 18 years of age must: emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity, if 8 (1)9 used consistently and correctly, is the only method that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually transmitted 10 infections, sexually acquired infection with 11 human 12 immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional distress that may be associated with adolescent 13 sexual activity [teach that sexual activity before marriage is 14 likely to have harmful psychological and physical consequences]; 15 (2) teach adolescents ways to recognize and respond to 16 unwanted physical and verbal sexual advances; 17 18 (3) teach that the use of alcohol or drugs increases a person's vulnerability to unwanted sexual advances; and 19 20 (4) emphasize the importance of attaining 21 self-sufficiency before engaging in sexual activity. 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 24
