A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the exception of certain information related to the
- 3 humane disposition by a municipality or county of an animal from
- 4 required disclosure under the public information law.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 552.1177 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 552.1177. EXCEPTION: CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN
- 9 INFORMATION RELATED TO HUMANE DISPOSITION OF ANIMAL. (a) Except as
- 10 provided by Subsection (b), information is confidential and
- 11 excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021 if the
- 12 <u>information relates to the name, address, telephone number, e-mail</u>
- 13 address, driver's license number, social security number, or other
- 14 personally identifying information of a person who obtains
- 15 ownership or control of an animal from a municipality or county
- 16 making a humane disposition of the animal under a municipal
- 17 ordinance or an order of the commissioners court.
- 18 (b) A governmental body may disclose information made
- 19 confidential by Subsection (a) to a governmental entity, or to a
- 20 person who under a contract with a governmental entity provides
- 21 <u>animal control services</u>, animal registration services, or related
- 22 <u>services to the governmental entity, for purposes related to the</u>
- 23 protection of public health and safety.
- 24 (c) A governmental entity or other person that receives

- 1 information under Subsection (b):
- 2 (1) must maintain the confidentiality of the
- 3 <u>information;</u>
- 4 (2) may not disclose the information under this
- 5 chapter; and
- 6 (3) may not use the information for a purpose that does
- 7 not directly relate to the protection of public health and safety.
- 8 (d) A governmental body, by providing public information
- 9 under Subsection (b) that is confidential or otherwise excepted
- 10 from required disclosure under law, does not waive or affect the
- 11 confidentiality of the information for purposes of state or federal
- 12 law or waive the right to assert exceptions to required disclosure
- 13 of the information in the future.
- 14 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 15 request for information that is received by a governmental body or
- 16 an officer for public information on or after the effective date of
- 17 this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
