## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to enhanced penalties for assault of employees of or
- 3 volunteers for certain clinics or facilities that provide abortion
- 4 or family planning services.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 22.01, Penal Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) An offense under Subsection (a)(1) is a Class A
- 10 misdemeanor, except that the offense is a felony of the third degree
- 11 if the offense is committed against:
- 12 (1) a person the actor knows is a public servant while
- 13 the public servant is lawfully discharging an official duty, or in
- 14 retaliation or on account of an exercise of official power or
- 15 performance of an official duty as a public servant;
- 16 (2) a person whose relationship to or association with
- 17 the defendant is described by Section 71.0021(b), 71.003, or
- 18 71.005, Family Code, if:
- 19 (A) it is shown on the trial of the offense that
- 20 the defendant has been previously convicted of an offense under
- 21 this chapter, Chapter 19, or Section 20.03, 20.04, 21.11, or 25.11
- 22 against a person whose relationship to or association with the
- 23 defendant is described by Section 71.0021(b), 71.003, or 71.005,
- 24 Family Code; or

- 1 (B) the offense is committed by intentionally,
- 2 knowingly, or recklessly impeding the normal breathing or
- 3 circulation of the blood of the person by applying pressure to the
- 4 person's throat or neck or by blocking the person's nose or mouth;
- 5 (3) a person who contracts with government to perform
- 6 a service in a facility as defined by Section 1.07(a)(14), Penal
- 7 Code, or Section 51.02(13) or (14), Family Code, or an employee of
- 8 that person:
- 9 (A) while the person or employee is engaged in
- 10 performing a service within the scope of the contract, if the actor
- 11 knows the person or employee is authorized by government to provide
- 12 the service; or
- 13 (B) in retaliation for or on account of the
- 14 person's or employee's performance of a service within the scope of
- 15 the contract;
- 16 (4) a person the actor knows is a security officer
- 17 while the officer is performing a duty as a security officer; [or]
- 18 (5) a person the actor knows is emergency services
- 19 personnel while the person is providing emergency services; or
- 20 (6) a person the actor knows is an employee of or
- 21 volunteer for a clinic or facility that provides abortion or family
- 22 planning services while the person is performing a duty for the
- 23 <u>clinic or facility</u>.
- 24 (d-1) For purposes of Subsection (b)(6), the actor is
- 25 presumed to have known the person assaulted was an employee of or
- 26 volunteer for a clinic or facility described by that subdivision if
- 27 the person was wearing a conspicuous badge or name tag or

- 1 distinctive clothing that would identify the person as an employee
- 2 <u>or volunteer.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 4 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 6 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 7 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 8 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 9 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 10 before that date.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
