11	(1) the resident demonstrates the ability to release

13	(2) the use of the wheelchair self-release seat belt

15	(3) the facility receives written authorization
16	signed by the resident or the resident's legal guardian for the
17	resident to use the wheelchair self-release seat belt.

- SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act 18 19 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 20 21 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 22

waiver or authorization is granted.

- 4 SECTION 4. Section 322.0515, Health and Safety Code, as
- 5 added by this Act, applies only to the use of a wheelchair
- 6 self-release seat belt occurring on or after January 1, 2018. Use
- 7 of a wheelchair self-release seat belt occurring before that date
- 8 is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective
- 9 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 10 purpose.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
