9	property [ <del>Property</del> ] that is contraband is subject to seizure and
10	forfeiture under this chapter.
11	(a-1) Property that is contraband is not subject to seizure
12	and forfeiture under this chapter if:
13	(1) the property is not otherwise unlawful to possess;
14	and
15	(2) the admissibility of the property as evidence
16	would be prohibited under Article 38.23 in the prosecution of the
17	underlying offense.
18	SECTION 2. Article 59.05, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
19	amended by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
20	(b-1) In a forfeiture proceeding under this chapter, the
21	attorney representing the state may only present evidence the
22	admissibility of which would not be prohibited under Article 38.23
23	in the prosecution of the underlying offense giving rise to the
24	forfeiture.

SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a forfeiture proceeding that begins on or after the effective date of this Act. A forfeiture proceeding that begins before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the proceeding begins, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
