2	relating to excused absences from public school for the purpose of

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 25.087(b-2), Education Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(b-2) A school district may excuse a student from attending
8	school to visit an institution of higher education accredited by a
9	generally recognized accrediting organization or a military
10	recruitment center or military installation for a branch of the
11	armed services of the United States during the student's junior and
12	senior years of high school for the purpose of determining the
13	student's interest in attending the institution of higher education
14	or enlisting in a branch of the armed services, provided that:
15	(1) the district may not excuse for this purpose more
16	than two days during the student's junior year and two days during
17	the student's senior year; and
18	(2) the district adopts:
19	(A) a policy to determine when an absence will be
20	excused for this purpose; [and]
21	(B) a procedure to verify the student's visit at
22	the institution of higher education, military recruitment center,
23	or military installation; and
24	(C) a procedure that requires written permission

- 4 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$ a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
