## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the elimination of certain formula funding and dropped
- course restrictions for students enrolled in 3 accelerated,
- 4 affordable baccalaureate programs at public institutions of higher
- 5 education.

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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 51.907, Education Code, is amended by
- adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows: 8
- 9 (b-1) This section does not apply to a student enrolled in
- an accelerated baccalaureate program created in collaboration with 10
- the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board that uses a 11
- competency-based model and year-round flat-rate tuition to 12
- facilitate degree completion, as verified by the coordinating 13
- 14 board.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.059, Education Code, is amended by 15
- 16 adding Subsection (r) to read as follows:
- (r) Notwithstanding any other law, the board may not exclude 17
- from being counted in the hours reported to the Legislative Budget 18
- 19 Board for formula funding contact hours or semester credit hours
- for a student's enrollment in a course for which the student has 20
- previously generated formula funding for the same course if the 21
- student is enrolled in an accelerated baccalaureate program created 22
- 23 in collaboration with the board that uses a competency-based model
- and year-round flat-rate tuition to facilitate degree completion, 24

- 1 <u>as verified by the board.</u>
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 61.0595, Education Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsection (f-1) to read as follows:
- 4 (f-1) In the formulas established under Section 61.059, the
- 5 board shall include without consideration of Subsection (a) or (e)
- 6 funding for semester credit hours earned by a student who is
- 7 enrolled in an accelerated baccalaureate program created by an
- 8 institution in collaboration with the board that uses a
- 9 competency-based model and year-round flat-rate tuition to
- 10 facilitate degree completion, as verified by the board.
- SECTION 4. Section 51.907(b-1), Education Code, as added by
- 12 this Act, applies beginning with the fall 2017 semester.
- 13 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 14 61.059 and 61.0595, Education Code, apply beginning with funding
- 15 recommendations made under Section 61.059, Education Code, for the
- 16 state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2019.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
