- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 15.052(b), Election Code, is amended to
- read as follows: 6

- 7 (b) The official confirmation notice response form must:
- (1) provide spaces for the voter to include all of the 8
- 9 information that a person must include in an application to
- register to vote under Section 13.002; [and] 10
- 11 describe the requirements of Section 15.054,
- 12 provide a space for the voter to indicate if the voter is exempt
- from those requirements, and provide a space to indicate the reason 13
- for an exemption, if any; and 14
- 15 (3) be postage prepaid and preaddressed for delivery
- 16 to the registrar.
- SECTION 2. Section 15.053(a), Election Code, is amended to 17
- read as follows: 18
- (a) Not later than the 30th day after the 19 date a
- confirmation notice is mailed, the voter shall submit to the 20
- registrar a written, signed response to the notice that confirms 21
- the voter's current residence. The response must contain: 22
- 23 (1) all of the information that a person must include
- 24 in an application to register to vote under Section 13.002; and

- 1 (2) evidence that the voter's residence address is
- 2 established in compliance with Section 15.054 or an indication that
- 3 the voter is exempt from those requirements.
- 4 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 15, Election Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 15.054 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 15.054. RESIDENCE FOR PURPOSES OF CONFIRMATION NOTICE
- 7 RESPONSE. (a) For purposes of Section 15.053, a person's residence
- 8 is established at the first residence address, beginning with
- 9 Subdivision (1) and continuing through Subdivision (6), in the
- 10 following list that is applicable to the person:
- 11 (1) the address stated on a driver's license issued to
- 12 the person by the Department of Public Safety that has not expired
- 13 or, if the person has notified the department of a change of address
- 14 under Section 521.054, Transportation Code, the new address
- 15 <u>contained in the notification;</u>
- 16 (2) the address stated on a personal identification
- 17 card issued to the person by the Department of Public Safety that
- 18 has not expired or, if the person has notified the department of a
- 19 change of address under Section 521.054, Transportation Code, the
- 20 new address contained in the notification;
- 21 (3) the address stated on a license to carry a
- 22 concealed handgun issued to the person by the Department of Public
- 23 Safety that has not expired or, if the person has notified the
- 24 department of a change of address under Section 411.181, Government
- 25 Code, the new address contained in the notification;
- 26 (4) an address corresponding to a residence at which
- 27 the person receives mail;

- 1 (5) the address the person claims as a homestead in
- 2 this state; or
- 3 (6) the registration address of a vehicle the person
- 4 <u>owns</u>.
- 5 (b) A person whose residence in this state has no address
- 6 may establish residence under this section by executing an
- 7 affidavit stating that the person's residence in this state has no
- 8 address, providing a concise description of the location of the
- 9 person's residence, and delivering the affidavit to the registrar
- 10 with the person's response to the confirmation notice.
- 11 (c) The address described by Subsection (a)(4) may not be a
- 12 commercial post office box or similar location that does not
- 13 correspond to a residence.
- 14 (d) This section does not apply to:
- 15 (1) a person who is a member of the armed forces of the
- 16 United States or the spouse or a dependent of a member;
- 17 (2) a person enrolled as a full-time student at an
- 18 institution of higher education;
- 19 <u>(3) a per</u>son whose address is confidential under
- 20 <u>Subchapter C, Chapter 56, Code of Criminal Procedure;</u>
- 21 (4) a federal judge, state judge, or spouse of a
- 22 <u>federal or state judge whose driver's license includes the street</u>
- 23 address of a courthouse under Section 521.121, Transportation Code;
- 24 or
- 25 (5) a peace officer whose driver's license omits the
- 26 officer's actual residence address under Section 521.1211,
- 27 Transportation Code.

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- 1 (e) Subsection (a)(1) does not apply to a person who holds a
- 2 commercial driver's license under Subchapter C, Chapter 522,
- 3 <u>Transportation Code.</u>
- 4 (f) The secretary of state shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 5 <u>implement this section</u>.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
