H.B. No. 402

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to money used by certain counties for the low-income vehicle repair assistance, retrofit, and accelerated vehicle 3 retirement program and local initiative air quality projects. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 403.071(b), Government Code, is amended 7 to read as follows: 8 (b) A claim may not be paid from an appropriation unless the 9 claim is presented to the comptroller for payment not later than two years after the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation 10 was made. However, a claim may be presented not later than four 11 years after the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation 12 from which the claim is to be paid was made if the appropriation 13 14 relates to: (1) new construction contracts; 15 16 (2) funding for a local initiative project described by Section 382.220 or 382.221, Health and Safety Code, that 17 involves construction in a county described by Section 382.221, 18 Health and Safety Code; 19 20 [, to] grants awarded under Chapter 391, Health (3) and Safety Code; 21 [, or to] repair and remodeling projects that 22 (4) 23 exceed the amount of \$20,000, including furniture and other equipment, architects' and engineering fees; or 24

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(5) [, and] other costs related to the contracts, [or]
 projects, or grants.

3 SECTION 2. Section 382.202(g), Health and Safety Code, is 4 amended to read as follows:

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(g) The commission shall:

6 (1) use part of the fee collected under Subsection (e) 7 to fund low-income vehicle repair assistance, retrofit, and 8 accelerated vehicle retirement programs created under Section 9 382.209; and

10 (2) to the extent practicable, distribute available 11 funding created under Subsection (e) <u>among</u> [to] participating 12 counties:

13 (A) in reasonable proportion to the amount of 14 fees collected under Subsection (e) in those counties or in the 15 regions in which those counties are located; and

16 (B) so that a county with a population of at least 17 four million receives 90 percent of the revenue derived from fees 18 collected in the county.

SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 382, Health and Safety
Code, is amended by adding Section 382.221 to read as follows:

21 <u>Sec. 382.221. LOW-INCOME VEHICLE REPAIR ASSISTANCE,</u> 22 <u>RETROFIT, AND ACCELERATED VEHICLE RETIREMENT PROGRAM AND LOCAL</u> 23 <u>INITIATIVE PROJECTS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES. (a) This section applies</u> 24 <u>only to a county with a population of at least four million that</u> 25 <u>participates in the low-income vehicle repair assistance,</u> 26 <u>retrofit, and accelerated vehicle retirement program created under</u> 27 Section 382.209.

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(b) To the extent that this section is inconsistent or in conflict with another provision of this subchapter, this section prevails. (c) A project a county implements under Section 382.220 may include a program to enhance transportation system improvements, including improvements meant to reduce congestion on existing roads, but not including toll projects. (d) A county may use fees collected under Sections 382.202 and 382.302 for a program or project described by Section 382.220 or this section. A county that receives money under Section 382.220 or this section: (1) is not required to provide matching funds for a program or project; and

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14 (2) may allocate money to a program or project under 15 Section 382.209, Section 382.220, or this section at the discretion 16 of the county.

17 (e) Money used by a county to implement a program or project under Section 382.220 or this section that involves construction 18 19 for a fiscal year may be distributed to the county to be used for the program or project in subsequent fiscal years if the money has been 20 made available to the county and has been treated as a binding 21 encumbrance by the commission before the end of the appropriation 22 year of the money appropriated for those purposes. Distribution of 23 24 the money is subject to Section 403.071, Government Code.

25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
