- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. ELECTROMAGNETIC FIELD LEVELS. Section 39.151,
- 6 Utilities Code, is amended by adding Subsections (o) and (p) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (o) The commission by rule shall identify and implement
- 9 design standards for the electric power transmission and
- 10 distribution system to limit electromagnetic field levels and
- 11 protect the transmission and distribution system.
- 12 (p) The commission by rule shall require the independent
- 13 <u>organization certified under this section to consider</u>
- 14 electromagnetic field levels when determining the public need for a
- 15 transmission line.
- 16 SECTION 2. ELECTRICAL POWER GRID RELIABILITY TASK FORCE.
- 17 (a) The electrical power grid reliability task force is created.
- 18 The task force shall study the likely effectiveness and costs of
- 19 various measures to protect and strengthen the electric power
- 20 transmission and distribution system against all hazards.
- 21 (b) The task force consists of five members appointed by the
- 22 lieutenant governor and five members appointed by the speaker of
- 23 the house. The task force:

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- 1 (A) determine the number of high voltage
- 2 transformers in this state; and
- 3 (B) evaluate the utilities' plans to improve

- 14 (5) make recommendations regarding the allocation of
- 15 costs of implementation, including recommendations for which
- 16 costs, if any, should be the responsibility of shareholders or
- 17 ratepayers; and
- 18 (6) determine the feasibility of implementing the
- 19 recommended actions.
- (e) Not later than September 1, 2018, the task force shall
- 21 prepare and submit to the governor and the legislature a report of
- 22 the task force's findings and recommendations.
- 23 (f) A member of the task force established under this
- 24 section is not entitled to compensation. Members may be reimbursed
- 25 for expenses as follows:
- 26 (1) a member is entitled to reimbursement for travel
- 27 and other necessary expenses as provided in the General

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- 1 Appropriations Act; and
- 2 (2) a member appointed as a representative of a state
- 3 agency is eligible for reimbursement for travel and other necessary
- 4 expenses according to the applicable agency's policies.
- 5 (g) The division of emergency management of the office of
- 6 the governor shall provide administrative support and staff to the
- 7 advisory task force established under this section.
- 8 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. The task force established under
- 9 this Act is abolished and this Act expires September 1, 2019.
- 10 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 11 1, 2017.
