## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a temporary justice of the peace.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 27.055(b), Government Code, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 If a justice is temporarily unable to perform official (b) 7 duties because of absence, recusal, illness, injury, or other disability, the county judge, on the judge's own motion or at the 8 9 request of the justice of the peace, may appoint a qualified person to serve as temporary justice for the duration of the absence of the 10 justice of the peace from the bench [disability]. The 11 12 commissioners court shall compensate the temporary justice by the day, week, or month in an amount equal to the compensation of the 13 regular justice. A temporary justice has all the rights and powers 14 of the justice of the peace while serving in that capacity but may 15 16 not make personnel decisions about, or significant changes in, the justice of the peace's office. 17

18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
