5	SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read

19	(6) [(5)] a victim of family violence as defined by
20	Section 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family
21	violence against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a
22	Class A misdemeanor;
23	<u>(7)</u> [(6)] a federal judge, a state judge, or the
24	spouse of a federal judge or state judge;

1 (8) [(7)] a current or former employee of a district 2 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal 3 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child 4 protective services matters;

5 (9) [(8)] an officer or employee of a community 6 supervision and corrections department established under Chapter 7 76, Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section 8 76.004(b) of that code;

9 <u>(10)</u> [(9)] a criminal investigator of the United 10 States as described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal 11 Procedure;

12 <u>(11)</u> [(10)] a police officer or inspector of the 13 United States Federal Protective Service;

14 <u>(12)</u> [(11)] a current or former United States attorney 15 or assistant United States attorney and the spouse and child of the 16 attorney;

17 <u>(13)</u> [(12)] a current or former employee of the office 18 of the attorney general who is or was assigned to a division of that 19 office the duties of which involve law enforcement;

20 <u>(14)</u> [(13)] a medical examiner or person who performs 21 forensic analysis or testing who is employed by this state or one or 22 more political subdivisions of this state;

23 (15) [(14)] a current or former member of the United 24 States armed forces who has served in an area that the president of 25 the United States by executive order designates for purposes of 26 26 U.S.C. Section 112 as an area in which armed forces of the United 27 States are or have engaged in combat;

1 <u>(16)</u> [(15)] a current or former employee of the Texas
2 Juvenile Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of
3 the department;

4 (17) [(16)] a current or former juvenile probation or
5 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice
6 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department,
7 under Title 12, Human Resources Code; and

8 (18) [(17)] a current or former employee of a juvenile 9 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section 10 261.405, Family Code.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
