 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the confidentiality of certain home address information
 1-22 in ad valorem tax appraisal records.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read
 1-25 as follows:

1-26 (a) This section applies only to:

1-27 (1) a current or former peace officer as defined by
 1-28 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, and the spouse or
 1-29 surviving spouse of the peace officer;

1-30 (2) the adult child of a current peace officer as
 1-31 defined by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;

1-32 (3) [~~(2)~~] a county jailer as defined by Section
 1-33 1701.001, Occupations Code;

1-34 (4) [~~(3)~~] an employee of the Texas Department of
 1-35 Criminal Justice;

1-36 (5) [~~(4)~~] a commissioned security officer as defined
 1-37 by Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;

1-38 (6) [~~(5)~~] a victim of family violence as defined by
 1-39 Section 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family
 1-40 violence against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a
 1-41 Class A misdemeanor;

1-42 (7) [~~(6)~~] a federal judge, a state judge, or the
 1-43 spouse of a federal judge or state judge;

1-44 (8) [~~(7)~~] a current or former employee of a district
 1-45 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
 1-46 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child
 1-47 protective services matters;

1-48 (9) [~~(8)~~] an officer or employee of a community
 1-49 supervision and corrections department established under Chapter
 1-50 76, Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section
 1-51 76.004(b) of that code;

1-52 (10) [~~(9)~~] a criminal investigator of the United
 1-53 States as described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal
 1-54 Procedure;

1-55 (11) [~~(10)~~] a police officer or inspector of the
 1-56 United States Federal Protective Service;

1-57 (12) [~~(11)~~] a current or former United States attorney
 1-58 or assistant United States attorney and the spouse and child of the
 1-59 attorney;

1-60 (13) [~~(12)~~] a current or former employee of the office

2-1 of the attorney general who is or was assigned to a division of that
2-2 office the duties of which involve law enforcement;
2-3 (14) [~~(13)~~] a medical examiner or person who performs
2-4 forensic analysis or testing who is employed by this state or one or
2-5 more political subdivisions of this state;
2-6 (15) [~~(14)~~] a current or former member of the United
2-7 States armed forces who has served in an area that the president of
2-8 the United States by executive order designates for purposes of 26
2-9 U.S.C. Section 112 as an area in which armed forces of the United
2-10 States are or have engaged in combat;
2-11 (16) [~~(15)~~] a current or former employee of the Texas
2-12 Juvenile Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of
2-13 the department;
2-14 (17) [~~(16)~~] a current or former juvenile probation or
2-15 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice
2-16 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department,
2-17 under Title 12, Human Resources Code; and
2-18 (18) [~~(17)~~] a current or former employee of a juvenile
2-19 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section
2-20 [261.405](#), Family Code.
2-21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
2-22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
2-23 provided by Section [39](#), Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
2-24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
2-25 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
