- 10 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date

- 12 propose rules implementing Section 21.054, Education Code, as

- 14 SECTION 3. An educator subject to continuing education
- 15 requirements immediately before the effective date of this Act is
- 16 not required to comply with the continuing education requirements
- 17 described by Section 21.054(d), (e), or (f), Education Code, as
- 18 amended by this Act, for any continuing education requirements
- 19 period that ends before January 1, 2018.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018
- 21 school year.
- 22 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
