## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to assessment of public school students and providing
- 3 accelerated instruction and eliminating performance requirements
- 4 based on performance on certain assessment instruments.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 28.0211, Education Code,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 28.0211. ACCELERATED LEARNING COMMITTEE [SATISFACTORY
- 9 PERFORMANCE ON ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS REQUIRED]; ACCELERATED
- 10 INSTRUCTION.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 28.0211, Education Code, is amended by
- 12 amending Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-3), (c), (f), (i), (k), and (n)
- 13 and adding Subsection (f-1) to read as follows:
- 14 (a) A district shall establish an accelerated learning
- 15 committee described by Subsection (c) for each student who does not
- 16 perform satisfactorily on:
- 17 (1) the third grade mathematics or reading assessment
- 18 <u>instrument under Section 39.023;</u>
- 19 (2) [Except as provided by Subsection (b) or (e), a
- 20 student may not be promoted to:
- 21 [(1) the sixth grade program to which the student
- 22 would otherwise be assigned if the student does not perform
- 23 satisfactorily on] the fifth grade mathematics or [and] reading
- 24 assessment instrument [instruments] under Section 39.023; or

- 1 (3) [(2) the ninth grade program to which the student
  2 would otherwise be assigned if the student does not perform
  3 satisfactorily on] the eighth grade mathematics or [and] reading
  4 assessment instrument [instruments] under Section 39.023.
- 5 (a-1) Each time a student fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(a) in 6 the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, or eighth grade, the 7 8 school district in which the student attends school shall provide to the student accelerated instruction in the applicable subject 9 10 area. Accelerated instruction may require participation of the student before or after normal school hours, [and] may include 11 participation at times of the year outside normal school 12 operations, and may be provided to the student during the 13 14 subsequent school year.
- 15 (a-3) The commissioner shall provide guidelines to
  16 districts on research-based best practices and effective
  17 strategies that a district may use in developing an accelerated
  18 instruction program. The commissioner may provide to districts
  19 available resources concerning research-based best practices and
  20 effective strategies that a district may use in developing an
  21 accelerated instruction program.

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(c) [Each time a student fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a), the school district in which the student attends school shall provide to the student accelerated instruction in the applicable subject area, including reading instruction for a student who fails to perform satisfactorily on a reading assessment instrument.] After a

- 1 student fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) [a second time], an accelerated 2 learning [a grade placement] committee shall be established [to 3 prescribe the accelerated instruction the district shall provide to 4 the student before the student is administered the assessment 5 instrument the third time]. The <u>accelerated learning</u> [grade 6 placement] committee shall be composed of the principal or the 7 principal's designee, the student's parent or guardian, and the teacher of the subject of an assessment instrument on which the 9 student failed to perform satisfactorily. 10 The district shall notify the parent or guardian of the time and place for convening 11 12 the accelerated learning [grade placement] committee and the purpose of the committee. [An accelerated instruction group 13 14 administered by a school district under this section may not have a ratio of more than 10 students for each teacher. 15
- (f) An accelerated learning [A school district shall provide to a student who, after three attempts, has failed to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) accelerated instruction during the next school year as prescribed by an educational plan developed for the student by the student's grade placement] committee described by [established under] Subsection (c) shall:
- 23 (1) develop an educational plan for the student that
  24 provides the necessary accelerated instruction for the student to
  25 achieve appropriate grade level performance; and
- 26 (2) provide other assistance to the student in 27 accordance with a policy adopted by the district board of trustees

- 1 prescribing the role of accelerated learning committees in that
- 2 district. [The district shall provide that accelerated instruction
- 3 regardless of whether the student has been promoted or retained.
- 4 (f-1) The educational plan developed under Subsection
- 5 (f)(1) must be designed to enable the student to perform at the
- 6 appropriate grade level by the conclusion of the <u>subsequent</u> school
- 7 year. During the school year, the student shall be monitored to
- 8 ensure that the student is progressing in accordance with the plan.
- 9 The district shall administer to the student the assessment
- 10 instrument for the grade level in which the student is placed at the
- 11 time the district regularly administers the assessment instruments
- 12 for that school year.
- 13 (i) The admission, review, and dismissal committee of a
- 14 student who participates in a district's special education program
- 15 under Subchapter  $\underline{A}$  [ $\underline{B}$ ], Chapter 29, and who does not perform
- 16 satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under
- 17 Subsection (a) and administered under Section 39.023(a) or (b)
- 18 shall determine[+
- 19  $\left[\frac{1}{2}\right]$  the manner in which the student will participate
- 20 in an accelerated instruction program under this section[; and
- 21 [(2) whether the student will be promoted or retained
- 22 under this section].
- 23 (k) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 24 implement this section[, including rules concerning when school
- 25 districts shall administer assessment instruments required under
- 26 this section and which administration of the assessment instruments
- 27 will be used for purposes of Section 39.054].

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- (n) A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an 1 assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) and 2 promoted to the next grade level [by a grade placement committee 3 under this section] must be assigned at that next grade level in 4 5 each subject in which the student failed to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) to a 6 teacher who meets all state and federal qualifications to teach 7 8 that subject and grade.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective 10 September 1, 2017, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
  12 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
  13 essential knowledge and skills in reading, writing, mathematics,
  14 [social studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection
  15 (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
  16 (b) or (l) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
- 17 (1) mathematics, annually in grades three through 18 seven without the aid of technology and in grade eight with the aid 19 of technology on any assessment instrument that includes algebra;
  - (2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;
- 21 (3) writing, including spelling and grammar, in grades
- 22 four and seven; and
- 23 (4) [social studies, in grade eight;
- 24 [<del>(5)</del>] science, in grades five and eight[; and
- [(6) any other subject and grade required by federal
- $26 \frac{law}{l}$ .

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SECTION 4. Section 39.023(c), Education Code, is amended to

1 read as follows:

- (c) The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment 2 instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, biology, 3 English I, and English II[, and United States history]. 4 5 Algebra I end-of-course assessment instrument must be administered with the aid of technology. The English I and English II 6 end-of-course assessment instruments must each assess essential 7 knowledge and skills in both reading and writing in the same 8 assessment instrument and must provide a single score. A school 9 district shall comply with State Board of Education rules regarding 10 administration of the assessment instruments listed in this 11 subsection. If a student is in a special education program under 12 Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and 13 14 dismissal committee shall determine whether any 15 modification is necessary in administering to the student an assessment instrument required under this subsection. 16 The agency 17 [State Board of Education] shall administer the assessment instruments. The commissioner, with input from school districts, 18 [State Board of Education] shall adopt a schedule for the 19 administration of end-of-course assessment instruments that 20 complies with the requirements of Subsection (c-3). 21
- 22 SECTION 5. Section 39.023(c-3), Education Code, effective 23 September 1, 2017, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 (c-3) The commissioner, with input from school districts,
  25 shall adopt [In adopting] a schedule for the administration of
  26 assessment instruments under this section that [, the State Board of
  27 Education shall require]:

- minimizes the disruption of classroom instruction 1 (1)[assessment instruments administered under Subsection (a) to be 2 administered on a schedule so that the first assessment instrument 3 is administered at least two weeks later than the date on which the 4 5 first assessment instrument was administered under Subsection (a) during the 2006-2007 school year]; and 6 7 (2) maximizes available instruction time
- 7 (2) maximizes available instruction time by
  8 scheduling the spring administration of [end-of-course] assessment
  9 instruments [under Subsection (c)] to occur as close to the end of
  10 the semester as possible [in each school district not earlier than
  11 the first full week in May, except that the spring administration of
  12 the end-of-course assessment instruments in English I and English
  13 II must be permitted to occur at an earlier date].
- SECTION 6. Section 39.02301, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (h), and (j) and adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:
- (a) The [During the 2015-2016 school year, the] agency, in coordination with the entity that has been contracted to develop or implement assessment instruments under Section 39.023, shall conduct a study to develop a writing assessment method as an alternative to the writing assessment instruments required under Sections 39.023(a) and (c). The writing assessment method must be designed to assess:
- 24 (1) a student's mastery of the essential knowledge and 25 skills in writing through timed writing samples;
- 26 (2) improvement of a student's writing skills from the 27 beginning of the school year to the end of the school year;

- 1 (3) a student's ability to follow the writing process
- 2 from rough draft to final product; and
- 3 (4) a student's ability to produce more than one type
- 4 of writing style.
- 5 (b) The [During the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 school years,
- 6 the] agency shall establish a pilot program as provided by this
- 7 section to implement in designated school districts the writing
- 8 assessment method developed under Subsection (a).
- 9 (h) [Not later than September 1, 2016, the agency shall
- 10 prepare and deliver to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the
- 11 speaker of the house of representatives, and the presiding officer
- 12 of each legislative standing committee with primary jurisdiction
- 13 over primary and secondary education a report covering the study of
- 14 the development of the writing assessment method under Subsection
- 15  $\frac{(a)}{(a)}$  Not later than September 1 of each <u>even-numbered</u> year [ $\frac{in}{(a)}$
- $16 \frac{2017 \text{ and } 2018}{2018}$ , the agency shall prepare and deliver to the
- 17 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 18 representatives, and the presiding officer of each legislative
- 19 standing committee with primary jurisdiction over primary and
- 20 secondary education a report that:
- 21 (1) evaluates the implementation and progress of the
- 22 pilot program under this section; and
- 23 (2) makes recommendations regarding the continuation
- 24 or expansion of the pilot program.
- 25 (j) Not later than September 1, 2021, the agency shall
- 26 modify the method for assessing students in grades four and seven in
- 27 writing based on the writing assessment method developed under this

- 1 section.
- 2 (k) This section expires September 1, 2021 [ $\frac{2019}{}$ ].
- 3 SECTION 7. Section 39.025, Education Code, is amended by 4 amending Subsections (c-1) and (f) and adding Subsection (f-1) to 5 read as follows:
- (c-1) A school district may not administer <u>a general subject</u> 6 7 [an] assessment instrument required for graduation administered 8 under this section as this section existed before September 1, 2007 [1999]. A school district may administer to a student who failed to 9 10 perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument described by this subsection an alternate assessment instrument designated by 11 the commissioner. The commissioner shall determine the level of 12 performance considered to be satisfactory on an alternate 13 14 assessment instrument. [The district may not administer to the 15 student an assessment instrument or a part of an assessment instrument that assesses a subject that was not assessed in an 16 17 assessment instrument required for graduation administered under this section as this section existed before September 1, 1999.] The 18 commissioner shall make available to districts information 19 necessary to administer the alternate assessment instrument 20 authorized by this subsection. The commissioner's determination 21 regarding designation of an appropriate alternate assessment 22 23 instrument under this subsection and the performance required on 24 the assessment instrument is final and may not be appealed.
- (f) The commissioner shall by rule adopt a transition plan to implement the amendments made by Chapter 1312 (S.B. No. 1031), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, replacing

- 1 general subject assessment instruments administered at the high 2 school level with end-of-course assessment instruments. The rules
- 3 must provide for the end-of-course assessment instruments adopted
- 4 under Section 39.023(c) to be administered beginning with students
- 5 enrolled in [entering] the ninth grade for the first time during the
- 6 2011-2012 school year. During the period under which the
- 7 transition to end-of-course assessment instruments is made:
- 8 (1) for students entering a grade above the ninth
- 9 grade during the 2011-2012 school year, the commissioner shall
- 10 retain, administer, and use for purposes of accreditation and other
- 11 campus and district accountability measures under this chapter the
- 12 assessment instruments required by Section 39.023(a) or (c), as
- 13 that section existed before amendment by Chapter 1312 (S.B.
- 14 No. 1031), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007; and
- 15 (2) a student subject to Subdivision (1) may not
- 16 receive a high school diploma unless the student has performed
- 17 satisfactorily, as determined by the commissioner under Subsection
- 18 (f-1), on the SAT, the ACT, or the Texas Success Initiative (TSI)
- 19 <u>diagnostic assessment</u> [each required assessment instrument
- 20 administered under Section 39.023(c) as that section existed before
- 21 amendment by Chapter 1312 (S.B. No. 1031), Acts of the 80th
- 22 Legislature, Regular Session, 2007].
- 23 (f-1) The commissioner shall determine the level of
- 24 performance considered to be satisfactory on the SAT, the ACT, and
- 25 the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) diagnostic assessment for a
- 26 student described by Subsection (f)(1) to qualify for a high school
- 27 diploma. In determining satisfactory performance, the

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- 1 commissioner shall ensure that the level of performance determined
- 2 under this subsection as satisfactory is equivalent to the level of
- 3 performance required under Subsection (a) for satisfactory
- 4 performance on an end-of-course assessment instrument.
- 5 Notwithstanding Subsection (f), the commissioner is not required to
- 6 retain, administer, or use assessment instruments described by
- 7 Subsection (f)(1) after September 1, 2017.
- 8 SECTION 8. Section 39.203(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (c) In addition to the distinction designations described
- 11 by Subsections (a) and (b), a campus that satisfies the criteria
- 12 developed under Section 39.204 shall be awarded a distinction
- 13 designation by the commissioner for outstanding performance
- 14 in academic achievement in reading [English language arts],
- 15 mathematics, or science[, or social studies].
- SECTION 9. Section 39.301(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (c) Indicators for reporting purposes must include:
- 19 (1) the percentage of graduating students who meet the
- 20 course requirements established by State Board of Education rule
- 21 for:
- 22 (A) the foundation high school program;
- 23 (B) the distinguished level of achievement under
- 24 the foundation high school program; and
- (C) each endorsement described by Section
- 26 28.025(c-1);
- 27 (2) the results of the SAT, ACT, articulated

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- 1 postsecondary degree programs described by Section 61.852, and
- 2 certified workforce training programs described by Chapter 311,
- 3 Labor Code;
- 4 (3) for students who have failed to perform
- 5 satisfactorily, under each performance standard under Section
- 6 39.0241, on an assessment instrument required under Section
- 7 39.023(a) or (c), the performance of those students on subsequent
- 8 assessment instruments required under those sections, aggregated
- 9 by grade level and subject area;
- 10 (4) for each campus, the number of students,
- 11 disaggregated by major student subpopulations, that take courses
- 12 under the foundation high school program and take additional
- 13 courses to earn an endorsement under Section 28.025(c-1),
- 14 disaggregated by type of endorsement;
- 15 (5) the percentage of students, aggregated by grade
- 16 level, provided accelerated instruction under Section 28.0211
- 17  $[\frac{28.0211(e)}{}]$ , the results of assessment instruments administered
- 18 under that section, [the percentage of students promoted through
- 19 the grade placement committee process under Section 28.0211,
- 20 subject of the assessment instrument on which each student failed
- 21 to perform satisfactorily under each performance standard under
- 22 Section 39.0241, and the performance of those students in the
- 23 <u>subsequent</u> school year [following that promotion] on the assessment
- 24 instruments required under Section 39.023;
- 25 (6) the percentage of students of limited English
- 26 proficiency exempted from the administration of an assessment
- 27 instrument under Sections 39.027(a)(1) and (2);

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- 1 (7) the percentage of students in a special education
- 2 program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, assessed through assessment
- 3 instruments developed or adopted under Section 39.023(b);
- 4 (8) the percentage of students who satisfy the college
- 5 readiness measure;
- 6 (9) the measure of progress toward dual language
- 7 proficiency under Section 39.034(b), for students of limited
- 8 English proficiency, as defined by Section 29.052;
- 9 (10) the percentage of students who are not
- 10 educationally disadvantaged;
- 11 (11) the percentage of students who enroll and begin
- 12 instruction at an institution of higher education in the school
- 13 year following high school graduation; and
- 14 (12) the percentage of students who successfully
- 15 complete the first year of instruction at an institution of higher
- 16 education without needing a developmental education course.
- 17 SECTION 10. Section 51.3062(q-1), Education Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (q-1) A student who has demonstrated the performance
- 20 standard for college readiness as provided by Section 28.008 on the
- 21 postsecondary readiness assessment instruments adopted under
- 22 Section 39.0238 for Algebra II and English III, as that section
- 23 existed before repeal by H.B. 515, Acts of the 85th Legislature,
- 24 Regular Session, 2017, is exempt from the requirements of this
- 25 section with respect to those content areas. The commissioner of
- 26 higher education by rule shall establish the period for which an
- 27 exemption under this subsection is valid.

- 1 SECTION 11. The following provisions of the Education Code
- 2 are repealed:
- 3 (1) Sections 28.0211(a-2), (b), (d), (e), (m), and
- 4 (m-1); and
- 5 (2) Section 39.0238.
- 6 SECTION 12. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 9 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 10 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 11 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 12 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
